




Global Health Framework for Action -A Comprehensive Approach-



✓ **Maintain the commitment for the health sector**

➤ **Health and Development Initiative (HDI)**

- Pledged: Approx. US\$ 5 billion for 5 years (2005-2009)
- Disbursement: Approx. US\$ 4.6 billion for 3 years (2005-2007)

➤ **Global Fund**

- Latest pledge: US\$ 560 million from 2009 for coming years
- Disbursement as of today: US\$ 1.04 billion
