1. Opening

 I reaffirm Japan would like to continue to further promote an understanding of Japan in Los Angeles, surely one of the greatest cities on the West Coast.

 However, I'd like to express my concern that there is movement to create unnecessary tension between ethnic groups in the U.S. recently.

3. Japan House

• There is an urgent need for Japan to strategically strengthen and improve our public relations and communication with other countries. Lately the Abe

Administration has started to consider founding the "Japan House," which would allow people from around the world to acquire a "true and accurate" image of Japan through first-hand experiences. This first-hand knowledge of Japan will no doubt lead to a greater number of people becoming Japan-experts and pro-Japan groups in the future. The great city of Los Angeles is one of the candidate cities of this project. I will put all of my efforts into making this project come to life.

• I am well aware that the support from local communities is essential for the success of this project, and requires close work between us. On this occasion, we would be grateful to hear your insights not only on this potential Japan House project here in L.A., but also on ways we can be more effective in our communication with people of this great nation.
