6. Voice from Participants

Cambodia, Student

All members of our group visited Japan for the first time. We realized that science and technology have developed in Japan irrespective of the metropolitan area or countryside, and have the feeling that all sectors have developed in Japan. At the same time, we found that traditional culture has been carefully preserved. For example, famous traditional crafts were displayed in museums. We sincerely respect such things. Cambodian people, including me, think that Japanese products are durable and quality irrespective of supplies or appliances. However, I feel products sold in Japan so expensive though Japanese people may feel them reasonable. In addition, I saw Japanese people driving giving way to each other without traffic jam because of the well-developed transportation infrastructure. I realized that Japan has a wonderful society among Asian countries and has developed dramatically.

On the program, I attended workshop seminars, enjoyed a variety of experiences, and visited famous areas in Japan. I also attended a lecture on present-day Japan, and I became more interested in Japan. At the National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation (Miraikan), I was able to learn more about the current cutting-edge technology in Japan, and its plans for the future. On a courtesy visit to the Aichi Prefectural Government Office, I came to understand much more about Aichi prefecture. In Japan, all working places, especially factories, enterprises, hospitals, supermarkets, public facilities, as well as houses, are equipped with cutting-edge technology, which makes everyday life easier. Punctuality is very important for Japanese people, and I feel we have to think more about it. Japan's agriculture is highly developed. On a visit to the Aichi Agricultural Research Center, I was very interested in research on new varieties of agricultural products and on the improvement of varieties that can survive harsh environments. I would like to learn more about this research and tell more about how far this research has come. I was impressed to find the Japanese way of life filled with politeness. My host family gave me a warm welcome, which made me more motivated to understand Japanese people deeply. I would like to follow their example. Support for domestic products is a vital need of farmers. We make it a standard to avoid using agricultural chemicals as often as possible. I think I will be able to communicate what I learned by visiting farms in Japan to Cambodian farmers and people in my living area.

Before I came to Japan, I thought Japan was a country of advanced technology. After I came to Japan, I was surprised to find that Japan was also a country of advanced agriculture. Japanese people are orderly and respect each other. There are a lot of natural disasters in Japan, but Japan has an excellent infrastructure. In Japan you can see wonderful roads, bridges, buildings and public transportation services, which cannot be found in Cambodia.

Thanks to Japanese hospitality or omotenashi, I have felt warm since the first day in Japan. In the lecture introducing Japan, I think that the participants gained a lot of knowledge from the lecturer. On a courtesy visit to the Aichi Prefectural Government Office, they also gained information about Aichi Prefecture and the strengths of Japan's agriculture as a whole through the explanation given by the prefectural government officials. In addition, at the Aichi Agricultural Research Center, we watched Japan's efforts toward agricultural development and the technology of Japan's agriculture, for example, from seed selection to packaging. At the Seijoh University, we interacted with Japanese students, and the Japanese calligraphy impressed us the most. And the experience I cannot ever forget is my homestay, through which we were able to understand the Japanese way of life more deeply. We slept in the same room together with our host family's children, ate together, took a walk together, and taught our native language to each other. This is how we shared the same experience. We took pictures together in order to tell others about our stay and experience in Japan.
