Overview

With international globalization and a society with declining birthrate and aging population, it is indispensable for Japan to utilize skills and talents of foreign nationals in order to promote the growth of the Japanese economy. The government is promoting growth under the “Japan Revitalization Strategy” by increasing the number of foreign tourists to Japan by relaxing visa requirements and promoting the country as a tourism destination, as well as by accepting highly skilled foreign professionals to Japan.

Looking at foreign nationals already residing in the country, particularly young people, it is certain that some have successfully adapted to their Japanese communities and contribute to the economy while others struggle to integrate, with some dropping out of school or becoming involved in criminal activity.

If young foreign nationals' integration into the Japanese society facilitated, it would certainly contribute not only to the economic growth of Japan including the promotion of local economies and a safe and secure society, but it would also foster strong diplomatic relations with other countries.

The workshop will discuss the following three issues under the overall theme of ‘advance together with young foreign nationals – challenge for future generations’:

- Language (Japanese and mother tongue) and international cooperation;
- Role of communities in local areas; and
- Role of Japanese business sector


