

TICAD V 2013: Progress with Japan's Assistance Package (Factsheet)



Commitment at TICADV: Public- and private-sector means of up to approx. JPY 3.2 trillion (equivalent to USD 32 billion), including ODA of approx. JPY 1.4 trillion (equivalent to USD 14 billion), between 2013 and 2017

ODA: JPY 1.4 trillion (equivalent to USD 14 billion) → **USD 3.51 billion** implemented (**progress: approx. 25%**)
Other means: JPY 1.8 trillion (equivalent to USD 18 billion) → **USD 2.08 billion** of official means for leveraging private investment and trade (eg. Financial support to projects by JBIC, financial incentives for resources exploration/development projects by JOGMEG, trade and investment insurance by NEXI etc.) (*private-sector investment has yet to be calculated*)

1. Boosting Economic Growth

- Industrial Development Policy advisors: Dispatched to **5 countries** (Tanzania, Mozambique, Morocco, Sudan, Cote d'Ivoire)
- Promotion of human resource development for sustainable resources development(1000 trainees): Approx. **400 people** trained
- Investment agreements Concluded with Mozambique. Negotiations with Kenya and Ghana underway. Negotiations with Tanzania to begin shortly.
- Japan-Africa Business Women Exchange Program: **First program** in January 2014
- Support for the function of One Stop Border Post system: Assistance being provided at **14 locations**. Facilities under construction in Tanzania and Rwanda.

2. Accelerating Infrastructure and Capacity Development

- Assistance for infrastructure approx. JPY 650 billion: **JPY 94 billion**
- Strategic masterplans in 10 locations: Underway or pledged in **three locations** (northern Kenya/Uganda corridor, Nacala (Mozambique) corridor, West Africa growth ring)
- ABE Initiative (1,000 people): Approx. **150 people** to come to Japan in September 2014
- Human resource development centers for business and industry (10 locations): Establishment in Ethiopia announced

3. Empowering Farmers as Mainstream Economic Actors

- Doubling of rice production in Sub-Sahara Africa to 28 million tons between 2008 and 2018: **20.7 million tons** (progress as of 2012: **47%**)
- Introduction of SHEP(Small Horticulture Entrepreneur Project)approach in 10 countries: Introduced in Kenya and Rwanda. Introduction in Egypt to begin soon
- Support for building food value chains: Post-harvest assistance underway in Cote d'Ivoire. Agribusiness assistance (farm mechanization) underway in Uganda.

4. Promoting Sustainable and Resilient Growth

- TREES Initiative in 34 countries: Being implemented in **20 countries**
- Assistance with disaster risk reduction in African island countries: Mauritius (installation of climate radar system, anti-landslide measures, coastal protection) Seychelles (coastal erosion and flood management)

5. Creating an Inclusive Society for Growth

- Provision of a better educational environment for 20 million children: Mathematics and Science education, improvement of school administration, construction of teacher training colleges etc. underway in **27countries**
- Health: Support of JPY 50 billion: Strengthening of healthcare systems with a view to providing Universal Health Coverage(UHC), training of healthcare professionals, maternal/child healthcare, prevention of infectious diseases, etc. underway in **27 countries**
- Water: Supply of and access to safe water and sanitation for 10 million people: Construction of water/sewerage infrastructure in urban areas and water-supply infrastructure in provincial areas underway in **19 countries**

6. Consolidating Peace, Stability, Democracy and Good Governance

- Conflict and natural disaster prevention assistance: **USD 550 million**
- Capacity building of 3,000 people engaged in peace-building: Total of **USD 6.59 million** disbursed to PKO training centers
- Ensuring maritime security off the coast of Somalia: Provision of patrol vessels to Djibouti (JPY 924 million, exchange of notes in March 2014)
- Resumption of direct bilateral assistance to Somalia: **ODA seminar** held in November 2013, resumption of grant aid **for grass roots and humanitarian assistance**
