# **Deployment of Self-Defense Force to the United Nations** Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH)

(1) Personnel: A total of 2,200 SDF Personnel was dispatched (Engineering Unit : 2,184 personnel, Staff officer: 12 personnel)

(2) Duration: from Feb. 2010 to Feb. 2013

(The Engineering Unit completed its activities in Haiti in October 2012.)

### (3) Deployment Area: Port-au-Prince

#### (4) Main Activities:

Clearing away rubble, Land leveling, Road repair,

Construction of simple facilities, Transportation of supplies Other activities (Training on the operation of vehicles etc.)

### (5) Achievement:

• Cleaning away rubbles and debris from roads in Port-au-Prince, government offices, and museum.

- ·Land leveling of hospital in Léogâne City
- •Demolition of school for the blind and clearing away rubbles
- Demolition of Hôpital Sanatorium de Sigueneau and clearing away rubbles
- Demolition of houses and clearing away rubbles (Cooperation with ODA)

#### (6) Grant of the materials and equipment on the occasion of withdrawal

- •Grant of Engineering equipment including dozer to the Haitian Government
- Grant of prefabricated houses including its equipment to the United Nation (MINUSTAH) (Note: MINUSTAH completed its mandate and MINUJUSTH started activities in Oct.2017)
