Speech by the Parliamentary Vice-Minister Kentaro Sonoura at the first session of the Japan House Steering Committee

Thank you very much for attending the first meeting of the Japan House Steering Committee. I greatly appreciate your enthusiasm and look forward to your active participation in the project.

As Parliamentary Vice-minister for Foreign Affairs in charge of this project, I have been closely involved in it from the start. I have been to all the cities featured in the project – Los Angeles, Sao Paolo and London – and am really glad to be in London again for this meeting with you all today. Holding the first meeting of the Steering Committee means that the Japan House project has finally started in earnest.
