Suggested future improvements

- Modify coverage of CRS purpose code 12240 on *Basic Nutrition*
- Introduction of a policy marker on *Nutrition-sensitive development*
- Introduction of multiple purpose codes (2018 reporting on 2017 flows)
- Possible creation of a new field to track SDG targets

Tracking nutrition through the CRS

Coverage of CRS code on Basic Nutrition

Proposal: remove school feeding and household food security from code 12240

122	12240 modify coverage	Basic nutrition	Direct feeding programmes (maternal feeding, breastfeeding (early initiation/exclusive and continued breastfeeding) and complementary feeding child feeding ; determination of micro-nutrient deficiencies (multiple micronutrients powder); provision of vitamin A, iodine, zinc, iron/folic acid supplementation etc.; monitoring of nutritional status and provision of SAM and MAM treatment; nutrition and food hygiene education. <u>Use code xxxxx for school feeding and household food security.</u>

Tracking nutrition through the CRS

New policy marker on Nutrition-sensitive development

Nutrition- sensitive development	Interventions that address the underlying determinants of fetal and child nutrition and development (food security including availability of food, economic access, and use of food; adequate feeding and caregiving resources at the individual, household and community levels; and access to and use of health services and a safe and hygienic environment). These interventions must incorporate specific nutrition goals, targets and outcomes.

Tracking nutrition through the CRS

Multiple purpose codes

- At present, only one purpose code can be assigned to each activity reported to the CRS.
- DAC members have agreed to implement a multiple purpose code system in the CRS, whereby an activity can, if relevant, be assigned more than one purpose code.
- Multiple purpose codes will be implemented in the CRS in 2018, and apply to the reporting of 2017 flows.

Tracking nutrition through the CRS

Possible new field to track SDG targets

- The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development calls for some adjustments to the CRS classifications.
- There is a good mapping between CRS purpose codes and several SDG goals.
- But a mapping of purpose codes and policy markers to the SDGs would likely be imprecise.
- DAC members are therefore considering a new field in the CRS to tag activities with the SDGs they support.
