



Juntos!! Japan-Latin America and the Caribbean Exchange Program
Young Diplomats and Government Officials for CARICOM Member States

1. Program overview

As a part of the “Juntos!! Japan-Latin America and the Caribbean Exchange Program” promoted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, a total of fourteen young diplomats and government officials from CARICOM (Caribbean Community) nations visited Japan from January 21 (Sun) to January 29 (Mon), 2018, and participated in programs for the purpose of deepening understanding of Japanese politics, economy and culture, etc. During their stay, the participants were provided opportunities to develop a wide-ranging understanding of Japan through various briefing, visits, etc. and each participant undertook the outward transmission of information on points of interest and experiences through SNS. In addition, at the workshop and reporting session held prior to leaving Japan, participants presented action plans to be implemented after arriving home.


