# Nomination to the World **Heritage List "Hidden Christian Sites in the** Nagasaki Region"

### The Goto Islands in Nagasaki Prefecture

he Goto Islands, the westernmost islets of Japan, are on the borders between the country and its East Asian neighbors and has thus been at crossroads of the region's intriguing history. Also, the Goto Islands are called "the Islands of Prayer", as is now represented by the Hidden Christian Sites on the islands. Following the introduction of Christianity to Japan in the 16th century and a total ban on the religion in the beginning of the 17th century, the Islands became home to Hidden Christians who crossed the sea from the mainland Kyushu in the end of the 18th century to
