

Humanitarian Assistance to Myanmar after the coup d'etat

1 Humanitarian Assistance since February 1, 2021 (Approximately 21 million US dollars)

- (1) Emergency Grant Aid for displaced persons and other vulnerable people in Bangladesh and Myanmar (9 million US dollars) ※via ICRC, WFP
- (2) Emergency Grant Aid in Improving Cold Chain in countries that suffer from the impact of Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) (2.09 million US dollars) ※via UNICEF
- (3) Emergency Grant Aid for food assistance to the populations affected by the coup in Myanmar (4 million US dollars) ※via WFP
- (4) Emergency Grant Aid for humanitarian assistance to the populations affected by the coup in the south east area of Myanmar (5.8 million US dollars) ※via UNHCR, UNICEF, WFP
- (5) Provision of oxygen concentrators for the treatment of COVID-19 patients in Myanmar ※via UNOPS

2. Humanitarian Assistance through Supplementary Budget in Fiscal Year 2021 (Approximately 18.5 million US dollars)

- (1) Emergency food and nutrition assistance to the most vulnerable populations in Rakhine, Kachin and Shan, Chin as well as peri-urban areas of Yangon (Approximately 4.62 million US dollars) ※via WFP
- (2) Emergency and Rehabilitation Activities for Myanmar (Approximately 2.77 million US dollars) ※via ICRC
- (3) Provision of child protection assistance to the most vulnerable, especially children and women, affected by the conflict in Myanmar (Approximately 1.86 million US dollars) ※via UNICEF
- (4) Protection and Lifesaving Assistance to Stateless and Displaced Populations in Myanmar (Approximately 1.83 million US dollars) ※via UNHCR
- (5) Provision of lifesaving sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) services to women and girls in Myanmar (Approximately 1 million US dollars) ※via UNFPA
- (6) COVID-19 Prevention and Support to Stateless and Displaced Populations in Myanmar (Approximately 3.0 million US dollars) ※via UNHCR
- (7) ICRC COVID-19 related operations in Myanmar in 2022 (Approximately 0.92 million US dollars) ※via ICRC
- (8) Humanitarian assistance to Myanmar through the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management (AHA Centre) (Approximately 2.53 million US dollars) ※via ASEAN Secretariat
