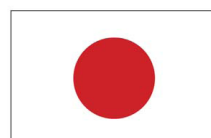

# 1. THE GGP OR "KUSANONE" PROGRAMME

Going to school, being treated at a clinic, drinking clean water, and living in a safe area without landmines... There are many places where people cannot live in such decent conditions.

In order to directly connect with these people and provide their basic needs, Japan's Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) programme was established.

The Embassy of Japan works directly with NGOs or local authorities to meet the diverse needs of local communities.

In Zimbabwe, the GGP programme started in 1989 and has since supported 141 initiatives throughout the country.

The GGP programme is the token of friendship from the people of Japan to the people of Zimbabwe. The many smiles and words of appreciation that we have received from the beneficiaries of our assistance are our greatest reward.

In Japanese, the GGP programme is called "Kusanone", which means "Grassroots": "Kusa" is grass and "ne" is roots. The special character of the scheme is called "Kusanoneko" (Grass Kitty): "neko", meaning cat, is a play on the word Kusanone.

## 2. TARGET AREAS

To meet basic human needs and ensure human security at the grassroots level, the GGP programme focuses on projects that will benefit people in utmost need. In particular, given the Zimbabwean context, the following areas are prioritised:

### Basic Education, such as:

- building new classrooms for ECD, primary school and secondary school
- providing furniture (desks and chairs for students/teachers)
- construction of teachers' accommodation.

### Healthcare, such as:

- establishing or renovating a clinic
- constructing maternity waiting homes, etc.

### Food and Nutrition Security, such as:

- constructing irrigation facilities for the common use of the community
- establishing an agricultural training centre, etc.

### Water and Sanitation (WASH), such as:

- providing boreholes for the common use of the community
- providing ablution facilities at schools, etc.

### Child Protection and Prevention of Gender-Based Violence, such as:

- constructing a counselling/education centre, shelter, etc.

### Support for Vulnerable People and People with Disabilities, such as:

- constructing a counselling/education centre, etc.

**On the other hand, the following areas cannot be funded under the GGP scheme:**

Projects that do not directly benefit people at the grassroots level, such as:

- ✗ Academic research, sponsorships and scholarships
- ✗ Capacity building of the applying organisation (staff training, providing office equipment, etc.)
- ✗ Private commercial businesses
- ✗ Projects that are not directly related to socio-economic development, such as cultural, sports and art activities, multi-purpose halls, etc.
- ✗ Projects that could include any political, military or religious intention.



### 3. ELIGIBLE ORGANISATIONS

An organisation must meet all of the following criteria to be eligible for GGP funding:

1. Be officially registered as a non-profit organisation (NGO, PVO, local authority, educational institution, medical institution, cooperative, etc.). **Individuals and for-profit organisations are not eligible.**
2. Be working for socio-economic development at the grassroots level
3. Have been operating for more than two years in the field of the proposed project
4. Have financial means to cover unexpected costs.

### 4. WHAT THE GRANT COVERS

The maximum amount of the grant for each project is, in principle, 10,000,000 Japanese yen. The amount in US dollars depends on the exchange rate – in 2021 it was equivalent to US\$ 92,592. The recipient organisation is obliged to utilise the entire grant exclusively for the approved project in the approved way.

Items that can be covered by the GGP scheme:

- ✓ Materials and labour costs for the construction of buildings
- ✓ Purchase of equipment which is essential for the project implementation
- ✓ Transportation costs for the approved items
- ✓ Costs for sign plates which show the support from Japan
- ✓ Cost for external audit.

The following items cannot be covered by the GGP:

- ✗ Any taxes or service fees paid to governmental organisations (VAT, etc.)
- ✗ Bank charges
- ✗ Consumable goods, such as medicines/vaccines, stationery, fuel
- ✗ Maintenance costs of facilities and equipment
- ✗ Running/administrative costs of recipient organisations, such as staff salaries, monitoring and evaluation costs, administrative costs, etc.
- ✗ Equipment and supplies not directly related to the project implementation, such as office equipment, kitchenware, books, computers and electronic devices, etc.
- ✗ Vehicles for general use (special vehicles such as refuse collection trucks, fire engines, and ambulances can be supported)
- ✗ Cost of purchasing/renting land (the land must be secured BEFORE applying for the grant).

## 5. HOW TO APPLY

An organisation interested in applying for the GGP grant must submit the following documents to the Embassy of Japan in Zimbabwe by email, post, or by hand (though email is much preferred). Please keep in mind that the manner of documentation is also one of the important criteria for screening.

There is no deadline for application; application forms can be submitted anytime throughout the year. Nevertheless, screening for each year's grant usually closes in April and August.

## 6. WHAT HAPPENS IF YOUR APPLICATION IS SUCCESSFUL ?

- Step 1:** Examination of the Proposal by the Embassy of Japan in Zimbabwe.
- Step 2:** Final Examination of the Proposal by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Tokyo.
- Step 3:** If your proposal is successful, we will hold a Signing Ceremony to sign the Grant Contract between the Embassy of Japan and the Recipient Organisation.
- Step 4:** Disbursement of the Grant.
- Step 5:** Implementation of the Project.
- Step 6:** Completion of the Project. **The project must be completed within one year after the grant contract is signed, and an audit report for the project must be carried out.** Once the project is complete, we will hold a Handover Ceremony.
- Step 7:** Follow-up Survey. About two years after the completion of the project, a follow-up survey on whether the granted items are still utilised and maintained properly is conducted by the Embassy.

## 7. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

**Q: Are the funds provided in US dollars?**

A: Yes, they are. The applicant organisation will need to open a Nostro account for the funds and obtain quotations in US dollars.

**Q: What if it is deemed that a change of plan is necessary during implementation of the project?**

A: The recipient is required to consult with the Embassy of Japan in advance to get prior approval. A letter mentioning the change of plan in detail must be sent to the Embassy for approval **before the plans are changed**. Any change in the project implementation can be made only when the Embassy of Japan judges it unavoidable or appropriate. In case there is any unapproved deviation from the agreed project plan, the Embassy of Japan may demand a refund of the grant.

**Q: Can we include boreholes?**

A: Yes, but presurvey costs must be covered by your organisation.

**Q: Is VAT covered by the GGP grant?**

A: No, the grant cannot be used to cover VAT. The NGO is requested to ask suppliers to provide quotations for goods or services excluding VAT, such as mentioning "this price does not include VAT" or "excluding VAT".

**Q: Are monitoring costs covered by the GGP grant?**

A: No, they are not. For this reason it is suggested that the project is within an easily manageable distance for the NGO, or the NGO has other ongoing projects in the same area.

**Q: Are bank charges covered by the GGP grant?**

A: No, the grant cannot be used to cover bank charges, so the NGO will be expected to cover these.

### CONSTRUCTION OF A CHILDREN'S REHABILITATION UNIT IN HARARE CENTRAL HOSPITAL (HARARE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL TRUST, 2019) - DR GREG POWELL, CHAIR



#### What were the challenges before the project?

The Children's Rehabilitation Unit (CRU) was located on the second floor of an old hospital building. Access was difficult because mothers had to negotiate two flights of stairs carrying a child with disability. Workshops and treatments had to be carried out in a cramped space and the mothers had to sit on the floor with their child.

#### What did Japan's support provide?

A spacious, open, purpose-built facility for training large groups of mothers and caregivers of children with disability. It ensures that the caregivers understand the causes and treatment of their child's condition, and thus helps to overcome the negative cultural beliefs associated with the birth of a child with disability in local culture. It also provided an adjacent playground when children can play while their mothers undergo training.



#### What are the outcomes of the project?

Parents and staff have welcomed the new facility, which has proved to be an ideal venue for workshops and training activities and a vast improvement on the old building. One huge and unplanned benefit of the new building is that it is ideal for group meetings in the times of COVID. The staff and clients of the CRU wish to express their deep gratitude to the Government of Japan for funding this important facility.

### CONSTRUCTION OF CHILD PROTECTION CENTRE IN CHIPINGE DISTRICT (SIMUKAI CHILD PROTECTION PROGRAMME, 2019) - MS BARBARA MATSANGA, DIRECTOR



#### What were the challenges before the project?

The rented building could not accommodate all the children in need of care with diverse cases of abuse. As a result, most victims of abuse could not have access to a safe environment, sometimes pushing them out of the family environment into undesirable living conditions. In addition, with the lack of nearby clinics or other necessary services, and lack of money to access support services, most survivors of abuse ended up failing to access services, and thus having unwanted pregnancies or contracting STIs or HIV and other problems that could have otherwise been avoided.

#### What did Japan's support provide?

Construction of the Simukai Chipinge Child Protection Centre. It provides post gender-based violence services such as clinical, legal, post trauma counselling and psycho social support amongst other services.

#### What are the outcomes of the project?

There has been a reduction in the number of children living outside family environments, and increased access to post-gender-based violence services in Chipinge District. Displaced children and survivors of all forms of abuse have been rehabilitated, and they have been reunified with their families and reintegrated with their communities. In cases of child abuse, there has been facilitation of justice delivery.





# OUR OUTCOMES

## IMPROVEMENT OF THE EDUCATIONAL ENVIRONMENT AT NYARUTOMBO PRIMARY SCHOOL IN MBIRE DISTRICT (MEDRA, 2019) – MS JUNIOR VUTOYI, NATIONAL DIRECTOR



### What were the challenges before implementation of the project?

The school had only one classroom block, and the children in other classes used to learn in makeshift classrooms made of mud and thatch, and under the trees. During the rainy season once signs of rains showed, the children were sent home as they could not be sheltered from the rain. There was insufficient housing for the teachers, so they would seek transfers to better schools. The children in Grade 7 had to travel to a school at least 10 km away to take their examinations, as Nyarutombo was not registered as an examination centre.



### What did Japan's support provide?

The project improved the quality of education offered at Nyarutombo Primary School through building of a new classroom block and completion of two other classroom blocks, provision of desks and chairs for four classrooms, building of a teacher's house, and building of two toilet blocks.

### What are the outcomes of the project?

There has been a 50% increase in the number of children in the area attending school, as well as a 50% increase in the number of girls completing Grade 7. In addition, there has been a 30% improvement in the literacy rate in the Nyarutombo area.

## IMPROVEMENT OF X-RAY EQUIPMENT OF MASHOKO CHRISTIAN HOSPITAL IN BIKITA DISTRICT (SOLIDARMED ZIMBABWE, 2019) – DR ALVERN MUTENGERERE, PROJECT MANAGER

### What were the challenges before the project?

The hospital is located in a very remote area with poor roads. It did not have any functional X-ray machine for years and people were referred to another hospital which is at least 100 km away. However, the people here are very poor and most cannot afford to travel that far for an X-ray.



### What did Japan's support provide?

Purchasing and installing a Fuji digital X-ray machine and installation of a solar system to power the equipment. Necessary renovations were made to the rooms, and staff were trained in the use of the new machine.

### What are the outcomes of the project?

The Japanese support has brought an X-ray service close to home for the people of Mashoko and there is now improved diagnosis and monitoring of patients. Digital technology eliminates the need for film development and processing, thus reducing costs for the patients. It also provides high quality images and allows remote consultation with experts, where local interpretation of the image is a challenge, thus improving diagnosis. Patients can now receive adequate quality case-management, potentially improving morbidity and mortality. Diseases are well diagnosed and well monitored. This results in reduced hospital stays, better disease outcomes, and more productive time.



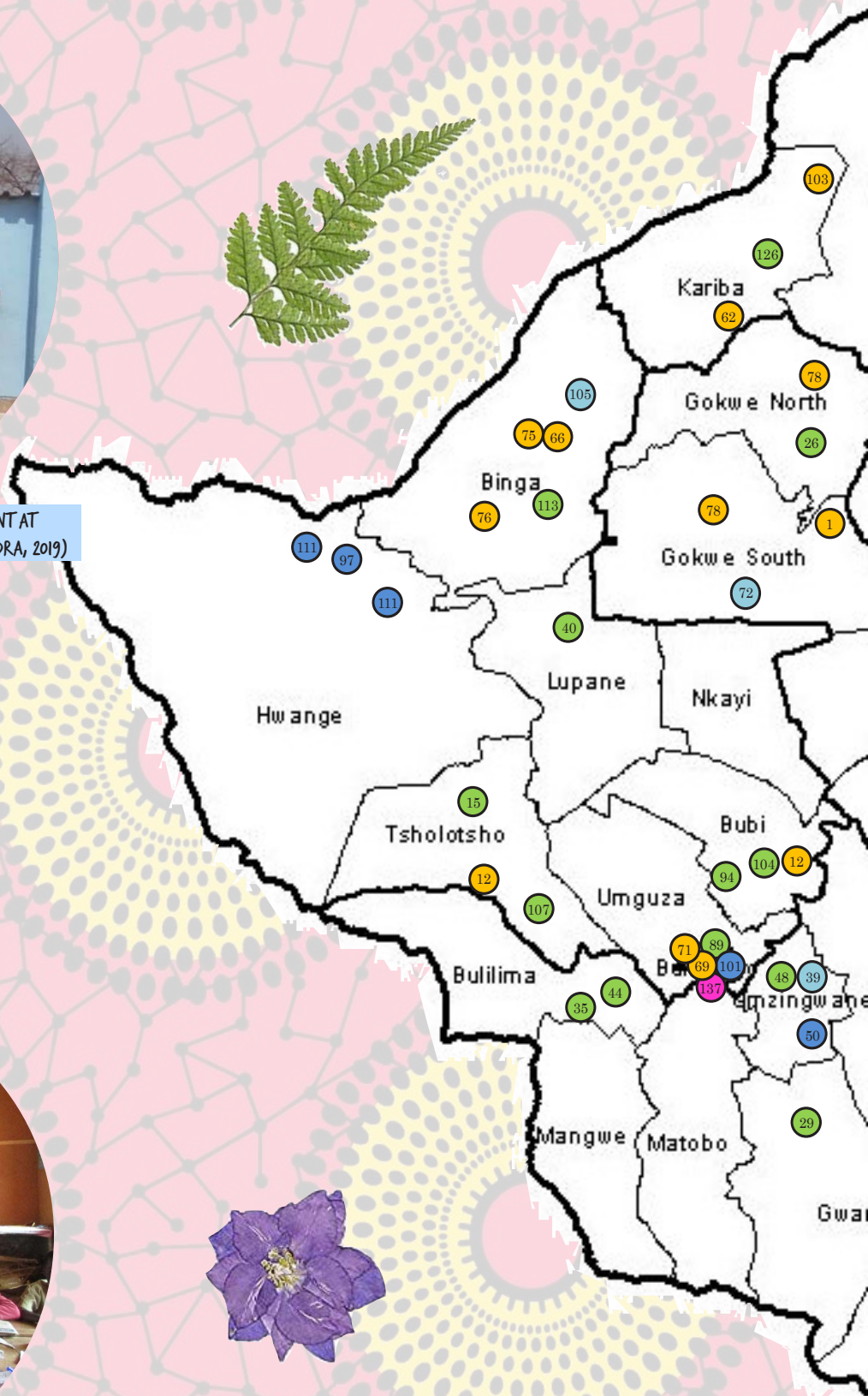
## 9. MAP OF GGP PROJECTS

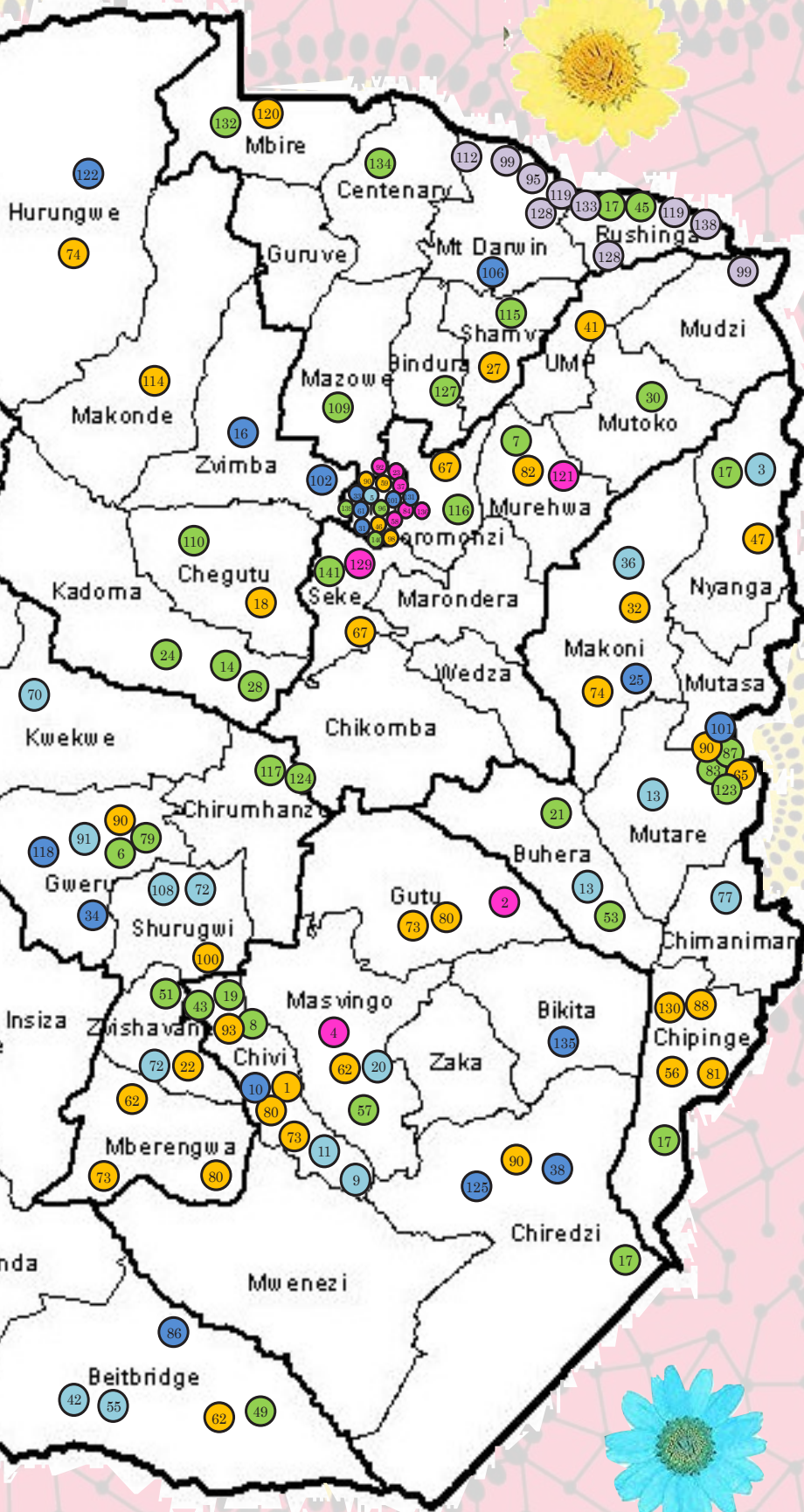
