

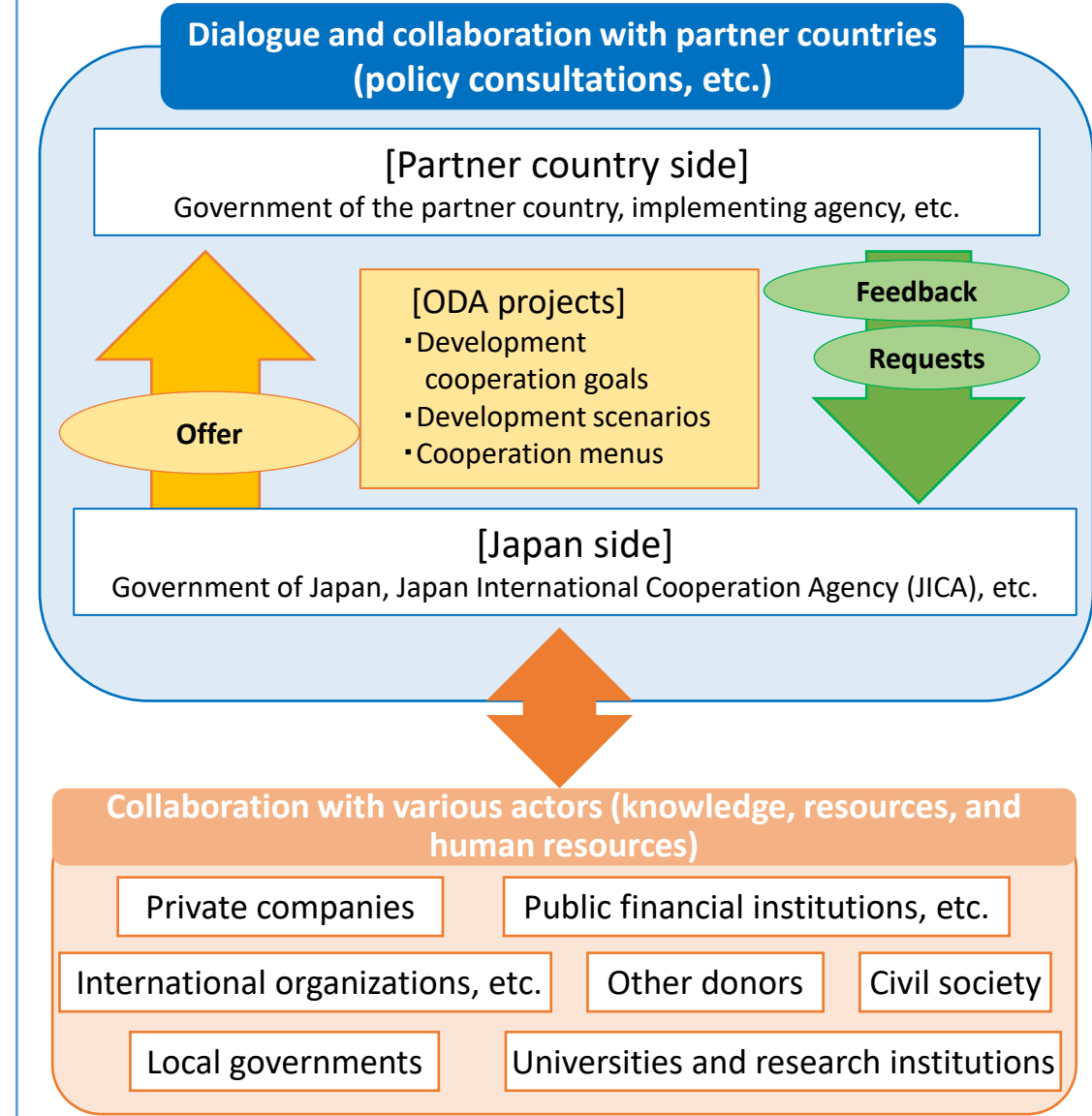
## 1. What is Co-creation for common agenda initiative?

- ✓ The Co-creation for common agenda initiative means forming projects through dialogue and collaboration with partner countries in which Japan actively proposes **development cooperation goals** in fields that should be strategically important and to solving complex development issues, as well as **development scenarios** (methods for achieving the aforementioned goals) and **cooperation menus** (combinations of projects that specifically implement the above goals) to achieve these goals, in a manner that leverages Japan's strengths and is attractive to the partner countries.
- ✓ In doing so, **various actors (private companies, public financial institutions, international organizations, other donors, civil society, local governments, universities and research institutions, etc.) are involved in the development platform** and pool their strengths to combine various forms of cooperation, thereby maximizing the development effects.
- ✓ This helps resolve the challenges of developing countries while leading to solutions for Japan's own challenges and growth of the Japanese economy.

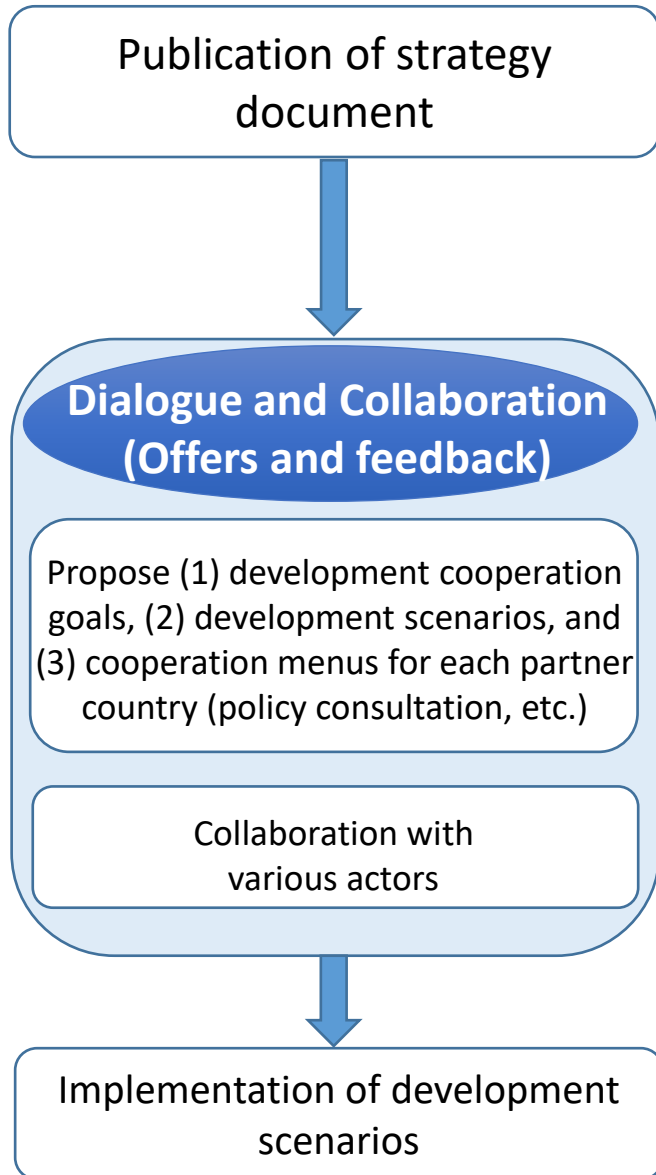

- Ministry of Foreign Affairs will issue a strategy document after selecting fields to strategically address through focused its resources and human capital. The strategy document will include (1) development cooperation goals and (2) development scenarios for each field.
- Based on the strategy document, the above items (1) (2) and (3) cooperation menus, which are tailor-made for each partner country, will be formulated and proposed to the partner countries.
- Through dialogues with and based on feedback from the partner countries, both sides share a direction of cooperation including by way of developing comprehensive arrangements, and ODA will be provided in an agile manner according to their needs. This will increase the predictability of project implementation and encourage the participation of various actors in projects.
- This will help resolve the challenges of developing countries while leading to solutions for Japan's own challenges and growth of the Japanese economy.
