

NIHONGO Partners Program

Dispatching Japanese people to secondary schools in ASEAN countries as "NIHONGO" Partners who assist Japanese language classes, introduce Japanese culture, and then return to Japan to serve as a bridge between Japan and their host countries.

- ➤ The Project of Human Resource Development Scholarship(JDS) (since 1999)
 - JDS supports human resource development by providing young leaders from target countries with full scholarships for graduate degrees in top Japanese Universities.

➤ The Ship for Southeast Asian and Japanese Youth Program (SSEAYP) (since 1974)

Invite and dispatch ASEAN-Japan youth for about 10 days to observe, experience, and exchange in various fields such as politics, economy, society, and culture.

- **✓ Approximately 47,000 people participated** (2007-2023)
- Sakura Science Exchange Program Inviting young talented individuals in science and technology fields from overseas
 - √ 14,980 people participated (2014-2022)
- ASIA KAKEHASHI Project +

High school students studying Japanese are invited to Japanese high schools for 4 to 10months.

- ✓ 655 people participated (2018-2023)
- ➤ Technical Cooperation by JICA(since1954)

Technical Cooperation supports human resource development and the establishment of administrative systems by accepting training participants in Japan and dispatching experts and Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers (JOCV), utilizing the knowledge, experience, and technologies of Japan.
