Policy Speech by Prime Minister Kishida at the University of Sao Paulo "Paving a Pathway to 'Human Dignity' with Latin America and the Caribbean"

 - Prime Minister Kishida delivered <u>a speech on Japan's foreign policy towards Latin America and the Caribbean for the first time in ten years</u>.
- Amid the deepening divisions and conflicts in the international community, PM Kishida emphasized Japan's unique engagement with LAC, which
 - (1) has a long history of exchange and deep personal ties with Japan,(2) is a partner that advocates values and principles shared with Japan,(3) possesses great potential for contributing actively to resolving global issues.
 - Based on the achievements to date, <u>PM Kishida showed a "pathway" that</u>

 Japan and LAC should pioneer over the next decade, to lead the world towards cooperation.

2 Key Messages

- PM Kishida clearly set out three directions in which Japan and LAC, and Japan and the world should work together to achieve a world caring for "human dignity".
- (1) Ensuring a free and open international order based on the rule of law

exchange programs at a scale of 1,000 people over the next three years.

- (2) Overcoming common challenges that humanity faces such as the environment and climate change
- (3) Pursuing prosperity that can be shared by all people in the world and does not come at others' expense
- Furthermore, PM Kishida stressed that while the goal we must achieve is the same, the "pathway" to take can differ country by country. He also highlighted the importance of positively accepting the

<u>diversity of "pathways", respecting, and learning from each other</u> to create a better future together.

■ What is indispensable to stride together towards these common goals is <u>people-to-people ties</u>. The ties among next generation, including the Nikkei community, are the key to create a new "pathway" of partnership between Japan and LAC. To support them, PM Kishida pledged Japan will implement
