Local Government In Australia

There are 537 councils in total across Australia as shown in this <u>map</u>. Of these, around 55% are regional, rural, or remote councils. Each of these local governments differ in size and population Facts and figures: Australia – LGiU

What are the responsibilities of Australian local government?

It varies between the states and territories, but councils in Australia generally have a statutory mandate for providing the following:

- local infrastructure
- water and sewerage services
- community services such as childcare
- health services such as food inspection, immunisation services etc
- are and recreation facilities for the elderly
- cultural and educational establishments
- commercial establishments including parking, cemeteries etc.





Welcoming Cities is a rapidly growing network of capital and urban cities, regional centres, and rural shires.

Welcoming Cities currently has 94 members, representative of 53% of the Australian population.
