Overview of the National Multicultural City Council



O Date of Establishment: November 7, 2012 C Legal Basis: Article 169 (Organization of Administrative Consultative Council) of the Local Autonomy Act O Background: In response to the global trend of multiculturalism and diverse values, the Council was established to proactively address administrative demands through the sharing of multicultural policies and cooperative exchanges among member cities. O Membership Criteria: Cities with either more than 10,000 foreign residents or a foreign resident ratio exceeding 3% Council Fee: KRW 3.6 million annually

Ansan City led the establishment of the council by encouraging active participation from member cities and served as the inaugural chair city.
