凡 例

1. 『條約改正關係日本外交文書』は昭和16年6月第1巻を刊行して以來昭和28年11月に至る迄の間に左の通り刊行を見た。
 - (1)第1巻 明治初年より明治12年まで
 - (2)第2巻 明治13年より明治20年まで
 - (3)第3巻 明治21年より明治25年まで
 - (4)會議錄 明治15年及び明治19年乃至明治20年の外交會議錄
 - (5)第4巻 明治26年より明治32年まで
 - (6)概 要 條約改正經過概要
 - (7)別 冊 小村條約以後の本邦通商條約と通商政策の變遷
 - (8)追 補 條約改正に關する追補文獻
2. 然るに、明治15年及び明治19年乃至明治20年の外交會議錄は和文の外に英、佛兩文に依り作成せられたものであるが、右(4)の會議錄としては單に和文のみが収録せられ、英、佛兩文の會議錄はその後諸種の事情もあり、今日に至る迄是れが刊行の豫定を實行し得なかつたのである。
3. 今や明治時代に於ける我が外交文書の編纂を終了するに當り多年實現し得なかつた右英文及び佛文の會議錄を明治年間追補の第2冊として茲に刊行することとした。
4. 本書には前記の通り明治15年に東京で開催された條約改正豫備會議及び明治19年乃至明治20年東京で開催された條約改正本會議の會議錄英文及び佛文の全部を収録した。
5. 収録の文書は原文を尊重して忠實に寫し、改正し又は増補することは一切しなかつた。

6. 豫備會議録の欄外上の数字は各當該會議録の頁數を示し、欄外下のそれは豫備會議全會議録の通し頁、同じく括弧内の数字は編者において設けた本書本文全體の通し頁であって、邦文目次はこの頁數によるものである。
