Japan will also continue to help resolve issues facing today's world such as disaster risk reduction, disarmament and non-proliferation, promotion of global development, and strengthening the rule of law relating to the sea, outer space and cyberspace. On development, Japan will strengthen its efforts towards achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and contribute to the formulation of the post-2015 development agenda through close cooperation with the other Member States, especially developing countries.

To achieve these noble goals, Japan presents its candidacy for a non-permanent seat on the UN Security Council for the term of 2016-2017. Japan believes that it is essential to reflect the broadest range of Member States' views in the Security Council. I am fully confident that Japan has the willingness and capacity to help the UN better fulfill its mission.
