




○ Country Meeting

- Composition
 - One nation is composed with president/prime minister and nine committee members (10 in total)
 - Nine committee members are mixed with Korean, Chinese and Japanese students as representatives of one nation




○ Committee Meeting

- Composition: Each Committee has 11 committee members



[Composition of Committee]

- Main Contents: Representatives of three countries suggest and share their ideas based on country meetings' results. Through several moderated and un-moderated caucus, three representatives draw a joint statement for three countries' mutual prosperity.



[Process of Committee Meetings]

Procedure	
Agenda Setting	Leading by Chair and Vice-Chair, committee members set specific agendas.
Introducing Agenda	Chair introduces specified agendas.
Opening Speaker's List	Representatives wishing to be put on the speakers' list may raise their placards. Once the speakers' list has elapsed, the Chair will open a new speakers' list. To be further added on to the speakers' list, representatives may raise a placard when the floor is open.
Voting Procedure	Voting procedure will take place to select ideas for joint statements. Vote can be passed or not to be passed by unanimous decision. If the vote fails, the second voting procedure will be opened.
Drawing Joint statements	Joint statements are written documents submitted upon agreement of three nations. In the first part of the joint statement, pre-ambulatory phrases should be used to explain the background or the history of the given agenda. In the second part of the joint statement, operative phrases should be used to describe actions encouraged by the committee.
Amendments	Delegates wishing to modify draft joint statements can write an amendment. An amendment is a written statement that adds, deletes or revises an operative clause of a draft joint statement.
Close of Debate	Two motions could be used to end a debate, which are "Motion to adjourn the meeting" and "Motion to Close Debate on Amendment/Joint statement". If the committee has not yet finished the session and will continue the session in the future, the meeting should be adjourned. If the committee has finished debating on an amendment/joint statement, the committee must close debate to move into voting procedures.

[Flow of Debate]


