The objective

To improve knowledge management and sharing of available tools, resources, technical assistance and opportunities for training amongst support providers, host governments and other stakeholders working on foreign direct investment in low-income countries.



The strategy

- Online Negotiation Support Portal to act as a 'one stop shop' for host governments wanting to prepare for investment.
- Regular Meetings of Support Providers to share learnings and coordinate interventions



The Portal has four main components:

- A **Roadmap** that maps out all stages of an investment project, starting with setting the regulatory and institutional framework through contract negotiation, implementation and monitoring of an investment project.
- ◆ Tools & Resources that can assistant governments at each stage of the investment process.
- ♦ A searchable database of the major **Support Providers** who provide technical assistance at the various stages.





The **Roadmap** breaks the investment life-cycle into four stages:

- 1. Setting the Legal and Policy Framework
- 2. Pre-Negotiation Stage
- 3. Contract Negotiation Stage
- 4. Contract Implementation and Monitoring.



The Roadmap

Each stage contains:

- A description of the issues that arise at that stage.
- ♦ Key tools that are available to assist with that stage.
- Other useful resources.
- Links to relevant support providers for that stage who are available to provide technical assistance to host governments on relevant issues.



Support Providers


A searchable database of major support providers that assist host governments with the various stages of investment.

Support providers are searchable on the basis of a number of criteria including:

- type of support provided and expertise available
- regional focus
- response time
- length of support
- whether or not a fee is payable.

Short trainings and professional development courses for government officials and policy makers.





Portal outreach and dissemination

- CCSI conducts workshops and feedback sessions with key stakeholders to continuously improve the uptake and the usefulness of the Portal.
- Eg, Workshop (in partnership with the AMDC, ALSF and NEPAD) in Pretoria, South Africa. The 40 workshop participants included representatives from African governments, development agencies, civil society, and academia.
- Regular presentations to governments and conferences.
- Use of social media to encourage uptake.
- Coordination with other online platforms, support providers and partners.

CCSI Meetings of Support Providers

- ♦ A forum for support providers to discuss common challenges and opportunities and to facilitate greater coordination.
- ♦ Attended by development banks (eg. IMF and the World Bank), government aid agencies (eg. GIZ), academic institutions (eg. CCSI) and CSOs (eg IISD and NRGI).
- ◆ 2015 meeting focused on monitoring and evaluation of technical assistance.
- ◆ 2016 meeting on trainings, capacity building programs, M&E, and alumni engagement.
- Meetings preceded by in-depth surveys, mapping and analysis to concretize meeting outcomes.

Next steps for meetings of support providers

- Many organizations are still experimenting with ways to increase the effectiveness of their interventions, means used for monitoring and evaluation, and complementary strategies (such as alumni engagement), that can be employed to enhance impact.
- Robust consensus for meetings of support providers to continue.
- Future meetings to be used for general coordination amongst support providers as well as to explore topics such as:
 - Strategies to address complex decision-making by governments during uncertain times;
 - A focus on support provider activities in one specific country or region; or
 - ♦ The collective impact of support providers and how more sustainable change in the sector can be achieved.
- Future meetings are open for funding and support.
