

Overview

- Public International Institution
 - ▶ Legal treaty registered with the UN
 - ► Governance: Governing Council and Management Board
- ► Hosted at the African Development Bank
- Membership
 - ▶ 52 Member Countries (46 African Countries)
 - ▶ 7 International Organizations (Africa Finance Corporation, AfDB, African Union, OHADA, West African Development Bank (BOAD), Ecowas Bank for Development (BIDC), Islamic Development Bank)
- ▶ Eligibility Requirements for Assistance
 - ▶ All regional member countries of the African Development Bank or African countries that are members of the ALSF.
 - Demands for assistance are initiated by the governments




Green Highlights - Primary areas of interventions








ALSF Capacity Building Efforts

- Principles
 - Demand driven
 - Relevant (Actual transfer of knowledge and skills)
 - > Tailor made for each situation Needs basis; key beneficiaries
 - > Partnerships where common objectives exist
- Types of Interventions
 - Every Project has a CB component
 - Specialised Sessions on demand using actual agreements (confidentiality critical)
 - Nomadic Training PPPs
 - ▶ Toolkits
- ► Total Number trained over 1,000 lawyers and experts



Knowledge Transfer

- ► Focus on developing skills at regional and national levels
- Working with both private sector advisors and public sector advisors
 - bar associations based on actual needs
 - private law firms focus on practice management and practical training
 - ▶ State institutions in the board room training program

Procurement

- Demonstrated commitment to transferring knowledge required for advisory projects, look at workload distributions
- Offering more opportunities to national advisers to select their international counterparts to ensure ownership



ALSF Capacity Building Efforts

Interaction with CONNEX Partners

- Future Activities include:
 - ► Further enhance existing knowledge products (resourcecontracts.org, AMLA, PPPIRC, Negotiation Support Portal)
 - Continuing country focused seminars based on member demand
 - ► Implement legal exchange program
 - Nomadic for Extractives
 - Boardroom training program for government officials sitting on company boards of directors
 - ► ALSF Academy developing uniform standards for commercial law issues
 - ► Capacity Building Database potential cross-partner information sharing
- ▶ 2018-2022 Medium Term Strategy, currently under development
