6. Voice from Participants

◆Nagasaki University

During my visit, I went to several places where Laos and Japan are related to each other. I recognized that the relationship between the two countries was closer than I had expected. I asked Lao students about what they thought of JENESYS programs or Japan's support. They said that the programs were very popular among the Lao students and they needed to apply for the programs soon after the call for applications was open. They also said that everybody wanted to go to Japan. Their comments made me realize that there is the perception gap about Japan's support between the Lao people and the Japanese and that our support has been helpful to the Lao people. In addition, it was found that, despite the different approaches to assist Laos, both of our government and companies respected the Lao people.

The Lao people have many good points. Some of those points are common in the people around the world and others are only for the Lao people. While Laos has been developing so rapidly, we are concerned that their good national character would disappear. Therefore, when I return home, I would like to share their wonderful national character and culture with our country's people so that our country's support projects might be tailored more. I believe that our country is capable to support other countries continuously considering their national character and culture. So it's important for our country to have approaches to supporting Laos with the common understanding.

The most impressive thing I have received during my visit to Laos has to be the home visit program. During the program, I had various experiences including the interaction with the Lao university students. We cooked and ate together. A good luck ritual was provided for me. My host grandmother over 110 years old and her family tied threads around my wrist praying for me. I was very happy.

I had firsthand experiences with the family bonds and the strong connection between people that have been lost in Japan. Since I study the community design at my university, I would like to acquire the skills of creating the happy atmosphere which I had in Laos. Furthermore, I would like to share the experiences with many people including our university's students.

◆Nagoya University of Arts and Sciences

There are two things that impressed me the most for my visit. One is the interaction with the Lao university students. They were well-educated in English and Japanese and were very kind. We got a very warm welcome. It was amazing that they knew about Japan amazingly well or better than we do even though they are learning the Japanese language. The other is the fact that the information and communication technology including SNS have been widespread in Laos.

The community is very important for the people of Laos and the connection among

people is very strong. They have many opportunities to meet people as they invite many guests for the wedding. As a result, they can express themselves very well. Upon my return, I would like to share many things about Laos, e.g. their kindness, gentleness, smiles, culture, food and custom with our country's people. While I'll share the information about Laos and connect the people, I hope I'll gain the skills to express myself which the Japanese are said to be lacking. At the same time, I would like to keep learning about Japan and share the Japanese food, kindness, the fusion of nature and new things with the people around the world including the Lao people.
