Poor rural people overcome poverty and achieve food security through remunerative, sustainable and resilient livelihoods

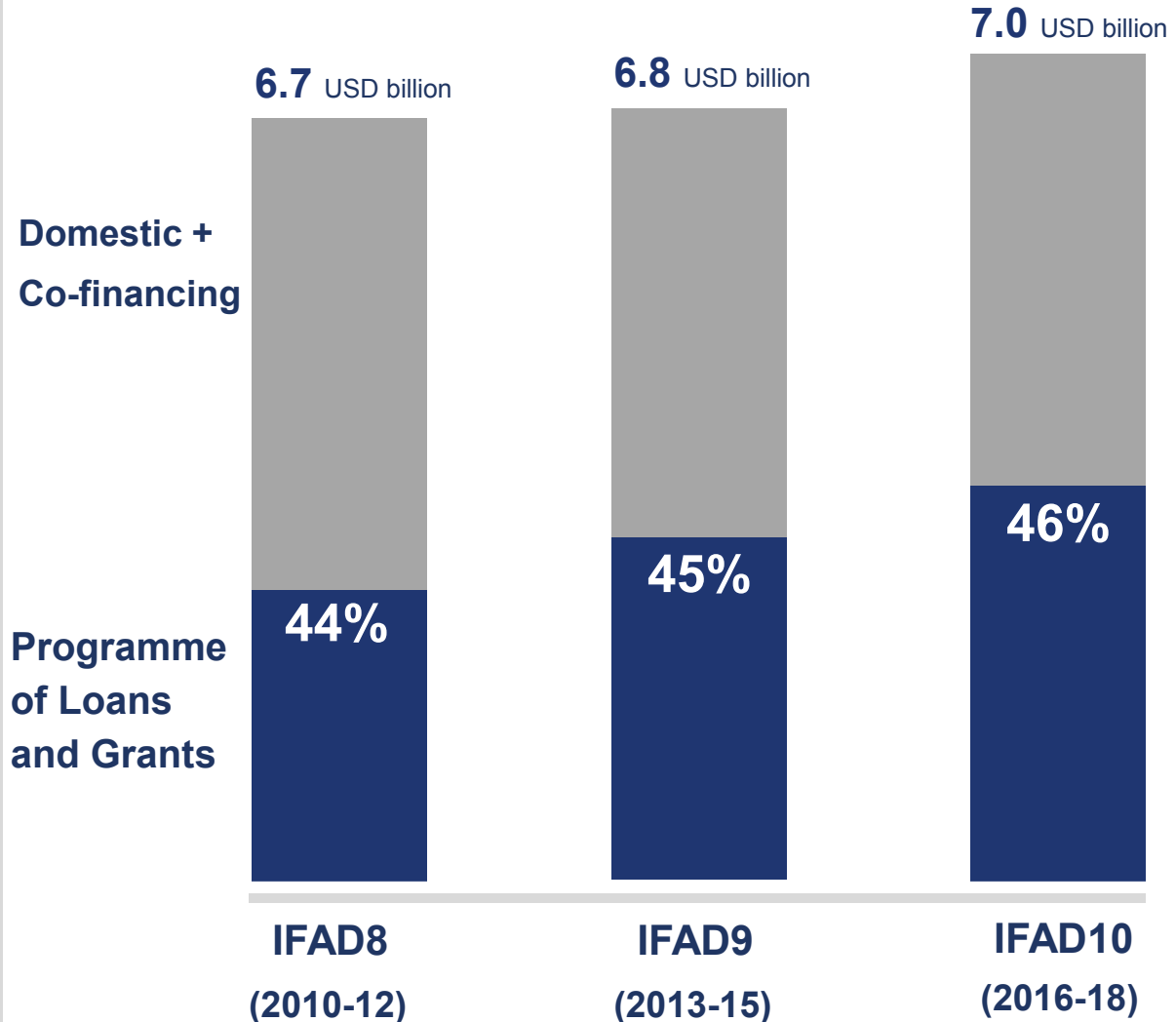

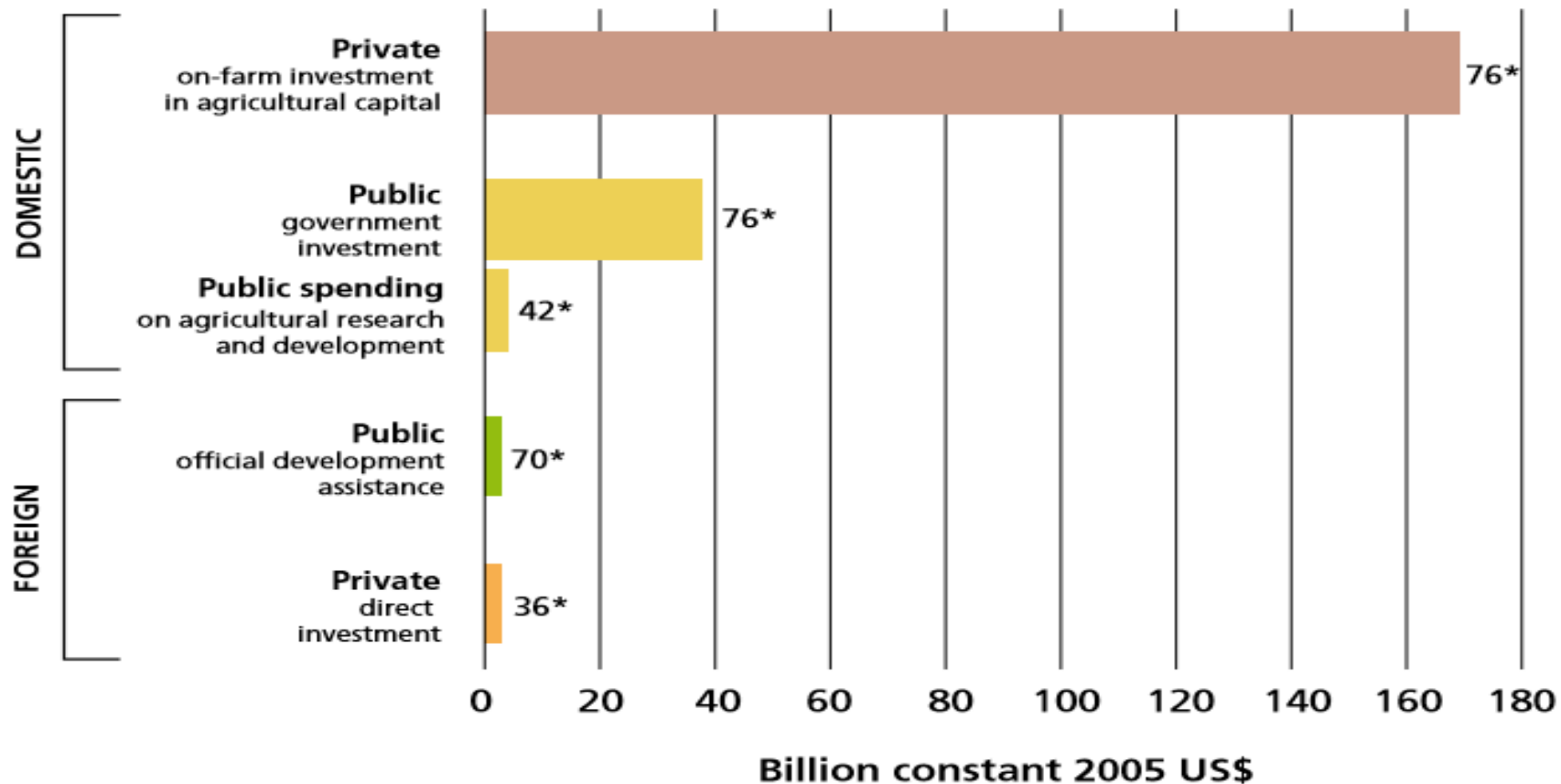

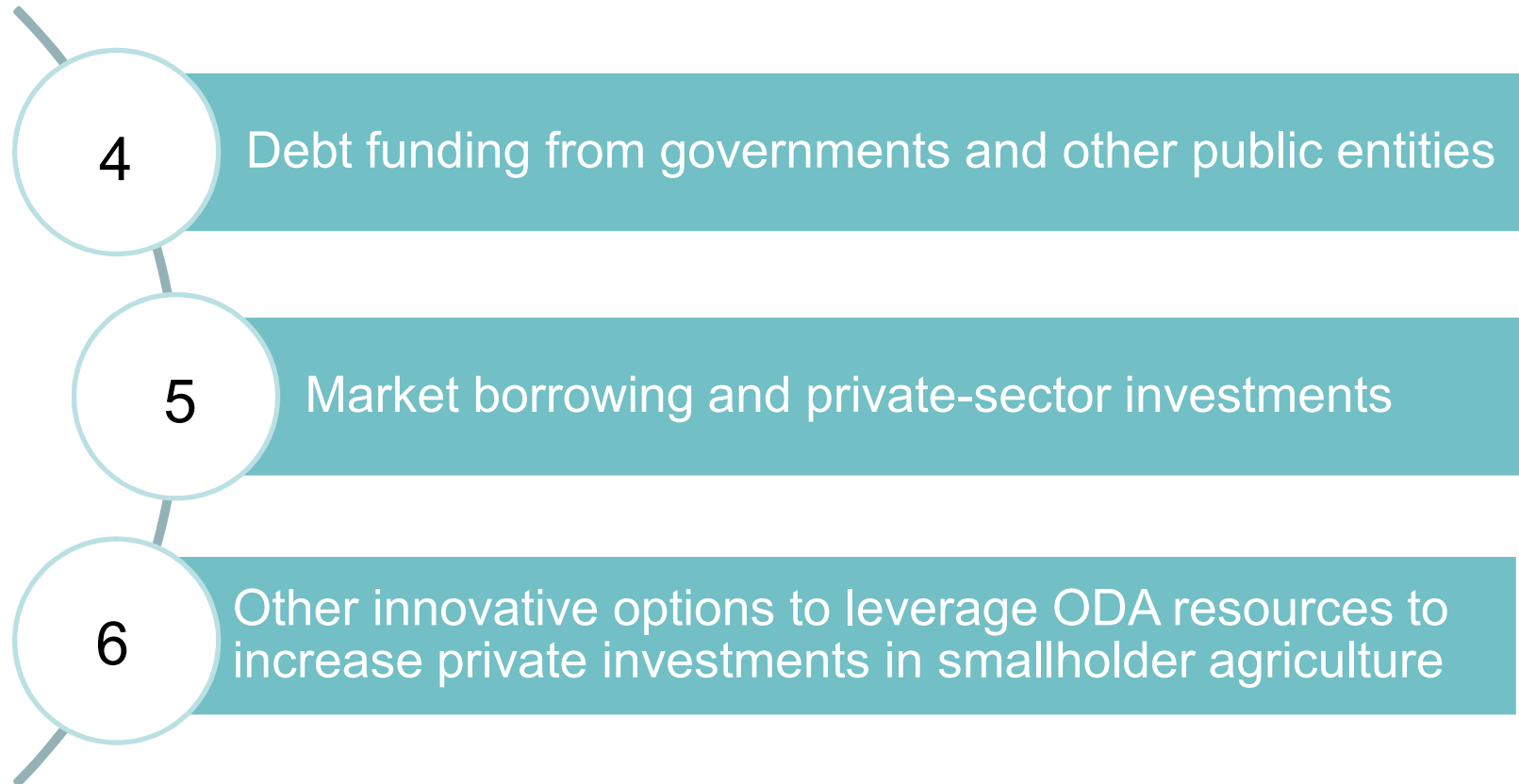


Estimated need for additional US\$265 billion per year during 2016-2030
