Program Report

1. Program Overview

As a part of the Exchange Program "JENESYS 2016," 20 university, graduate school students, supervisors from India, 30 university students, supervisors from Indonesia, 51 high school, vocational school, university, graduate school, supervisors from Singapore, and adults, university, and graduate students relevant to Media from Malaysia arrived in Japan. They stayed in Japan from December 13 to December 20 in order to participate in programs aimed at enhancing their understanding of Japan with regard to Japanese politics, economy, society, culture, history, education, and foreign policy. Through visiting local autonomies, companies, homestay, and other activities, the participants exposed themselves a wide range of opportunity to know about Japan more and shared their individual interests and experiences through SNS. In the reporting session, each group comprised by them presented action plans reflected their learning and finding during the program, will be implement after returning to home countries.

4. Voice from Participants

♦India, Student

The first thing which I like after landing here is cleanliness and found almost no pollution (air, noise) anywhere in Japan. Here the development is well advanced and done in manner to use resources efficiently. Our lecture program which was given by a professor and dean, Mr. Suzuki about innovation in Japan and how Japan differs from others in innovation is very interesting and new thing we learn. We found that Japanese people are multitalented and are customer centered so their innovation is really at best level.

In school exchange, we have been told about the ongoing research in biomedical engineering which is very interesting and have immediate need in society. This area is my interest to make some software which would help us. We went to JAXA, AMDA and other industry where we find state of the art technology and new innovation and new ideas to do something differently and efficiently.

The best part of this program is being guest to Japanese family. We found people here

are very helpful, very gentle, very caring and very loving. This is my best stay to any family ever. I have learned many things about Japan and Japanese families.
