1. Program Overview

Under "Japan's Friendship Ties Programs", 22 Japanese University students who are interested in introducing attractive Japan overseas visited Singapore during the 9 days program from February 28 to March 8, the delegates introduced various attractive Japan to people of Singapore. The participants learned the historical relationship of both countries from the lecture at Embassy of Japan and JETRO. To visit Newater Visitor Centre they understood the importance of security of water resources in Singapore. The participants visited two schools, then made presentations and performed traditional culture of Yamagata prefecture. They also had fruitful time for 2 days and 3 nights home stay program, the delegates exchanged opinions with host families using in English.

The participants are further aiming to promote Japan through mediums such as SNS.

4. Voice from Participants

♦ Yamagata University Student

What I have felt through this visit is that Singapore is a good place to live in. Not only abundant Japanese products and Japanese companies but also people are very kind to the foreign nationals. I presume this is because there are mixed races and religions. What has impressed me most was the risk control skills of the nation. For example, strict punishment for the criminals restraining the crimes, measures taken for the water issues which is highly important for Singapore, positive attitude of inviting the foreign companies and human resources and high level of education and so on. The secret of this small country's rapid development would be the sense of risk management of the people. On the other hand, in Japan, there is no denying that people are kind of satisfied with the today's development and not prepared for the risks. I hope Japan would develop further getting stimulated by such growing country. In my part, I think I should go on to the higher education studying English so that I can keep up with the foreign students.

I was interested in Singapore because the country has a high level of education and science technology. I have learned the process of country's independence and the path to the current social system. In the exchange program with each schools, I came to know the popularity of Japan as well as my insufficient knowledge about my country. As we don't have many chances to speak English in our daily life, we found it difficult to communicate with the students whereas they speak Japanese fairly well which surprised me a lot.

At the homestay, my host family lived in a public flat and they talked about a lot of their local life. Especially I was interested in their education system which was totally different from Japan and also the difference of facilities and school life. Furthermore, the stories of conscription system were unbelievably surprising for us.

Today, Japan is a rich country. However, countries in the world are not always so fortunate and each country has its own culture and style. I think I should always look out at the outside world to exchange information and communicate with people to seize Japan in the world and also myself. So, I would like to take a forward attitude challenging tasks. I think I have obtained not only the knowledge and experience but also the new foreign friends and English ability.

One of my impressions is there are many people in Singapore who like Japan. I was glad that wherever I visited, I met with such pro-Japanese people who might say they have been to Japan, or they have lived in Japan, or they could speak Japanese and so on. I understand that Singaporeans have long term visions. They always asked me what was my future dream at ITE, NTU or host family's but I could not answer clearly. I thought it

reflects the nationality to plan ahead as the national government strategies are so. I assume not many Japanese have their own clear visions or dreams. I often came across the idea that consideration to the disabled people was not sufficient in Singapore. For example, textured paving was only available at the end of the crossing which would make it difficult for them to walk on the street straight compared to Japan. As various people from various countries gather in Singapore, I felt there would be more parts to be improved in the environment as Japan has developed for the disabled.
