JENESYS2018 ASEAN Inbound Program 24th Batch Program Report Sports Exchange (Women's Football), Country: 7 ASEAN countries

1. **Program Overview**

159 youths, who belongs to the football team, and football officials from 7 ASEAN countries (Cambodia, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Malaysia, Myanmar, Lao PDR) visited Japan from February 28 to March 7, 2019 under the scheme of "Japan's Friendship Ties Programs: JENESYS2018" and participated in the program with the theme of "Sports Exchange (Women's Football)."

The delegation visited Tokyo and Okinawa prefecture. They attended a lecture regarding Japan's contribution to the Asian football to better understand Japan, did joint training, friendly match and cultural exchange at the Zanpa Ball Park and Yomitan Athletics Stadium from March 1st to 6th. Besides football, they had a city tour and Japanese cultural experience. During the program, they deepened mutual understanding between countries, and cultivated friendships, and they disseminated their findings and interests in Japan by using Social Networking Service. At the reporting session before returning home, they made a presentation on an action plan which utilizes the experience of their visit to Japan after their return to their home.


5. Voice from Japanese Locals

[Cambodia Team]

- We will disseminate our concerns related to football during our stay in Japan by SNS.

- [Singapore Team] Project title: Okinawa x SG (Singapore)
