JENESYS2018 ASEAN Outbound 9th Batch Program Report Theme: Japanese Language Communication and Japanese Culture Exchange (Timor-Leste)

1. Program Overview

Under the "JENESYS2018" of Japan's Friendship Ties Program, 18 Japanese university students visited Timor-Leste from February 19 to February 27, 2019 to participate in the program aimed at promoting the understanding of Japan with regard to its politics, economy, society, culture, history, and foreign policy. This batch is held under the theme of "Japanese Language Communication and Japanese Culture Exchange".

The delegation enhanced their knowledge about the relationship between Japan and Timor-Leste, Timor-Leste people, culture and lifestyle through the meeting with government officials, observation of Japan 's ODA site and JOCV activity, school exchange, home-visit experience and city and suburbs tour. During the school exchange program, they cultivated the friendship between Japan and Timor-Leste youths, and they delivered a presentation of the attractiveness of Japan. They shared their individual discovery, interests and experiences through social media. In the final reporting session, they reported about both the discovery in Timor-Leste and the action plans to be implemented after returning to Japan for government officials and local residents.

4. Voice from Participants

• University Student (Akita University)

I noticed there are differences between life in Timor-Leste and life in Japan. For example, many people don't wear shoes outside. I felt that the sanitary condition has a room for improvement in Timor-Leste. However, all of them showed big smile to us. It seems to me that they may share their lives with family and neighbors and cooperate with each other. As a reason that we didn't find economic gap among Timor citizens, I strongly feel that family love is a top priority in Timor-Leste and that will make a strong family bonds.

• University Student (Hokkaido University of Education)

I could learn from Japanese people who live in Timor-Leste and JENESYS alumni about their activities and problems of this country. It was really meaningful. I also learned about history of independence movement at the Resistance Museum and also heard of experiences during that time from my host family. Even though Timor-Leste might have several issues in the field of industry and education, I think this country is really promising because the students are highly motivated and people have close relationship and support each other.

• University Student (Waseda University)

I learned the creation of the major industry is a big issue for Timor-Leste. Labor productivity of agricultural industry is low and the oil industry does not contribute to job creation, therefore, young generations are facing difficulties in getting the job. On the other hand, through the home-visit program, I noticed that people have vitality and a sense of solidarity among family members. I felt that we should not only compare their life with our life but also need to learn from them what is the important thing to feel happiness and to make one's living meaningful. The students were really excited when I used their mother language, Tetum. Through exchange program, I enjoyed wearing their traditional costume and learn their traditional dance. That was really good experiences. The program was warmed up when we showed Japanese traditional dance, Soran-Bushi. This is also one of the best memories we got in Timor-Leste.
