

# JENESYS2018 ASEAN Inbound Program 3rd Batch Program Report Exchange for Political and Railroad officials, Country: Malaysia

## 1. Program Overview

20 youths from Malaysia visited Japan from September 25th to October 2nd 2018 under the scheme of "Japan's Friendship Ties Program JENESYS2018" and participated in the program with the theme of "Exchange for Political and Railroad officials".

This group visited Tokyo, Saitama, and Miyagi, attended a lecture to better understand Japan and another lecture related to the theme of the program, visited railroad-related facilities, and exchanged opinions with representatives. They also gained deeper understandings of Japan and its people, and nurtured friendship through homestay and exchanges meetings with representatives and local people. At the reporting session before leaving Japan, they announced their plans to spread information through social media about their experiences in Japan and what they found interesting during their stay. They also presented their action plans making use of their experiences in Japan, which are to be implemented on their return to their home countries.

### 4. Voice from Participants

## **Employee of a Malaysian railroad company**

The lectures I attended during the program were very rich in contents; I learned things that people usually do not and would not know. It was fulfilling to learn a lot about Japanese transportation and the manufacturing industry. At companies and factories in Japan, they adapt the way they work to the circumstances, in a timely manner. I think this way of working can be introduced in Malaysia too, to improve work efficiency. Every member of my host family was very friendly and courteous; I made some lifelong memories.

I gained a lot of knowledge from the lectures. I managed to fully understand the various subjects related to the theme of the program, especially Japanese technology and Shinkansen. They offered detailed explanations at the companies we visited, which deepened my understanding. I also learned a lot about the composition, components, and equipment of Shinkansen. The homestay provided us a good opportunity to learn about Japanese culture and lifestyle. We had an excellent time listening to the lecture at Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism, where we gained valuable information.

# Voice from Japanese Locals Host Family

As one of the participants could speak Japanese, we managed to enjoy the three days without using a tablet translator this time. Although they had a busy schedule packed with activities such as cooking, tea ceremony, Kimono-wearing, pottery, trying a Japanese meal with rice cakes, miniature golf, and shopping, the participants from Malaysia seemed to be very happy. We treated them like our own daughters, and were tearful when we had to say good bye to them. I said to them "next again (see you again)" as they were leaving.
