JENESYS2019 ASEAN Inbound Program 5th Batch Program Report Theme: Exchange for Disaster Prevention and Environment Country: Lao P.D.R

1. Program Overview

19 youths from Laos visited Japan for a period of 9 days from October 15th to 23rd as part of the Japan's Friendship Ties Programs "JENESYS 2019". The delegation visited Tokyo, Hiroshima and Chiba to have opportunities of international exchange under the theme of "Disaster Prevention and Environment". In Tokyo, they attended a theme-related lecture and visited garbage disposal facilities and facilities for disaster prevention education. In Hiroshima, they had a lecture at the Resilience Research Center, visited an affected area by the Torrential Rain in July 2018, and experienced a homestay in Hiroshima City to deepen their understanding of Japanese initiatives on disaster prevention technologies and promote friendship between Japan and Laos. In Chiba, they visited Isumi city and observed local farming and fishing facilities. During the program, the participants shared their discoveries and experiences through social media. At a reporting session before leaving Japan, the group presented an action plan (activity plans after returning home) to convey their experience while visiting Japan.

4. Feedback from participants (excerpt)

- I'm so pleased to visit Japan that I was able to learn about Japanese recycling, sewerage system, disaster prevention, agriculture, and more. I also learned a lot about Japanese Culture and lifestyle. Through the homestay experience, I learned their behavior pattern, dinner, way to respect each other, and more. There are many differences between Japanese and Laotian as well as many similarities. People are always exact on time and have good manner, streets are pretty anywhere in Japan. I'll pass what I learned through this program on people in my country to promote better understandings of Japan.
- Before I visited Japan, I have had a certain degree of knowledge about environmental management and disaster prevention as an expert. After I observed the sites and activities of this field, I realize that Japan is a country of latest technology which enables Japanese people to solve environmental problems and prepare for natural disasters. You can say that people's behavior pattern also has an effect on disaster prevention:

Japanese people value well-planned life and regular routine, so that they can immediately associate with their government in any critical situation to solve the problems. I'm sure that what I have learned through this program will play an important role in my specialized field and in the activities contribute to the development of all of society in Laos. I really want to spread Japanese culture and way of thinking in my country.

- People are always punctual. This punctuality must help them to do their job properly.
- Cleanliness and environmental protection. As far as I observed, there was no waste on the street and people separate recyclable garbage from non-recyclable garbage before they throw them away. This must be helpful for garbage disposal system.
- Respect each other. Greeting. People always give thanks to each other. That must lead them to be aware of social manner and good behavior.
