

JENESYS2020 Japan-ASEAN, Timor-Leste Online Exchange (Sports: Rugby) Report

1. Program Overview

[Objective] The program was conducted to provide lectures on Japan's contribution to the world of rugby in Asia (Asian Scrum Project), and provide exchanges through sports for youth involved in sports and sports education in ASEAN countries and Timor-Leste, with the aim of promoting of friendship between participating countries, and to preserve the legacy of the first Rugby World Cup in Asia.


