

JENESYS2020 Japan-Viet Nam Online Exchange (Communication, Education and Japanese Culture (Sub-theme: manufacturing technology)) Record

1. Program Overview

[Objective] This program was conducted with the main objective of promoting educational exchange between Japan and Viet Nam by deepening the understanding of Japanese language education and culture among Viet Namese youth who are interested in Japan and the Japanese language, and to contribute to the spread of Japanese language education and the development of Japanese speakers in Viet Nam. Some of the students who participated from Japan visited Viet Nam in past outbound programs, and it was an opportunity for them to reunite with the Vietnamese students they had interacted with.

[Participants] Total: 86 high school students, vocational high school students, undergraduate/ graduate students and working youth from Viet Nam

5. Dissemination by the participants, articles, etc.

On September 7 th (Tue), we exchanged online with high school students in Quang Nam, Viet Nam. As part of the Japan's Friendship Ties Programs, we along with other Wakayama high school students were dispatched to Viet Nam in January 2020, and interacted with the local high school students. The exchange was held online this time and students were hesitant, but were still engaging during the school presentations, making the exchange even more beneficial.	High school students from Quang Nam, Viet Nam and Wakayama Prefecture held an online school exchange. This project was part of MOFA's Japan's Friendship Ties Programs, with high school students from 6 schools in Wakayama, and 2 schools from Viet Nam. 5 students from our school participated in the exchange, where each school introduced their characteristics, and we introduced the charms of Hashimoto High School and Hashimoto City using a PowerPoint. In the group discussions, we learned about schools, food culture, and many other charms of Viet Nam, as well as their relationship with Japan. With the exchange being held in English, we acknowledged the importance of English as a communication tool. It was a very fulfilling exchange, in a very friendly atmosphere.
