JENESYS2021 Japan-ASEAN and Timor-Leste Art Exchange (14th Asian International Children's Film Festival) Report

1. Program Overview

[Objective] The main objective of this program was to further deepen the interest and understanding of high school students from ASEAN countries and Timor-Leste toward filmmaking and Japan through viewing past Asian International Children's Film Festival films and exchanges with youth of the same generation through school introduction videos produced by the students themselves.

After hearing about the city's specialties such as its onions, and its activities such as cycling and kawara-wari (roof tile breaking), the Chat exchange that unfolded was lively, with the participants expressing their desire to one day visit Japan together. During the Q&A session, many questions were asked, including on how COVID-19 was affecting the city as a whole.
