JENESYS2021 Japan-Thailand Online Exchange (Japanese Language Learners Inbound Program) Report

1. Program Overview

[Objective] This program was conducted with the main objective of providing Thai high school students interested in Japan and the Japanese language with opportunities to learn about Japanese culture, the Japanese language, and Japan's cutting-edge science and technology, to give them further motivation to study Japanese, and to have them promote an understanding of Japan in themselves and their surroundings after returning home.




We taught each other about our countries. There were some factors that our countries shared.
