1 Summary

- ●The potential of Africa is a driving force of global growth. "Investment in people" is urgent and important.
- Recognizing importance of multilateralism. Commitment to working together based on international law including the UN Charter, and <u>respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity</u> of all countries. Emphasizing that all countries must seek <u>peaceful resolution of disputes</u> in accordance with international law.
- Taking good note of the initiative of a <u>Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP)</u>.

- (1) Economy: Realizing structural transformation for sustainable economic growth and social development
- Private sector investment, technology transfer, industrial human resources development are crucial. Emphasizing the roles of start-ups to resolve social challenges.
- Promoting Green economies. Commitment to supporting just transition. Promoting of Japan's <u>"Green Growth Initiative with Africa (GGA)."</u>
- •Support the strengthening food security and nutrition. Support sustainable agriculture, food systems and value chains.
- •Strengthening a free, open and fair international economic system. Importance of <u>sound</u> <u>development finance adhering to international rules and standards</u>.
- •Quality infrastructure investment, connectivity and the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), the blue economy.

(2) Society: Realizing a resilient and sustainable society

- The necessity of building a resilient and sustainable society to achieve human security and the SDGs.
- Promoting efforts in the health sector to achieve UHC. Africa's appreciation for Japan's contribution through COVAX and the Global Fund.

(3) Peace and Stability: Realizing Sustainable Peace and Stability

- Democracy, good governance, the rule of law are crucial. The necessity of maintaining a rules-based maritime order in accordance with the principles of international law.
- Reaffirming our commitment to realizing a world without nuclear weapons. Being committed to maintain and strengthen the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT).
- Ukraine (Expressing serious concern about the situation in Ukraine, importance of the preservation of peace through dialogue, supporting African countries to overcome the increasing food and energy prices, etc.)
- Reform of the United Nations Security Council (Reaffirming support for the African Common Position, and with this in mind, being determined to cooperate to accelerate the reform of the Council.)

(4) Future TICAD Process

TICAD 9 will be held in Japan in 2025. A TICAD ministerial meeting will be held in 2024.
