1. Program Overview

[Objective] This program was conducted with the main objective of having Indonesian youth contribute to the peace and security of the Asian region. Participants conducted visits and exchanged opinions pertaining to traditional Japanese culture, history and religious views as a means to further their understanding of Japan and to promote mutual understanding.
