A delegation of Brazilian parliamentarians who are visiting Japan under the national project visited Deputy Mayor Yutaka YAMANA at the Hamamatsu City Government on the 27th to exchange opinions to strengthen cooperation between the two countries and cities.

"I've been looking forward to coming to Hamamatsu, which has the largest number of Brazilians in the country," Senator Nelson said in his greeting. Noting that Hamamatsu accepted 464 athletes from Brazil during a training camp for the Tokyo Olympics and Paralympics, Mr. Yamana said, "This has helped realize a symbiotic society in Hamamatsu."

Parliamentarians mentioned their requests for the support for Brazilian citizens' employment and education, and expressed thanks for a warm welcome to Brazilian citizens.
