5. Proposals and recommendations from experts (excerpts)

■ Program implementation content

- ✓ It is difficult to understand Japan deeply in a brief period of 10 days. Before visiting Japan, it is a good idea to study what the participants want to learn in Japan in order to know various types of appeal of Japan.
- ✓ It is also important to let them know that Japan also is interested in the Latin American region. Thus, why not expand the scale of outbound projects? Furthermore, it is important that continued implementation of Juntos!! allows people in the Latin American region to recognize the project.
- ✓ It is significant not only for diplomatic ties but also for human exchanges such as this project to be carried out continuously.
- ✓ It is necessary to develop programs that enable participants to understand Japan effectively in a short time under universal issues (such as the SDGs) that draw the interest of participants.

■ Suggestions for follow-up

✓ I think it would be better to have a follow-up program that allows the participants to retain their attention on Japan after participating in the program. After participating in the program, if there are opportunities to deepen understanding of Japan and exchanges and learning among people who are interested in Japan, such as alumni meetings, their interest in Japan will continue and lead to greater influence.
