1. Kangemi (Oldest slum in Nairobi)

3. Kangemi Health Centre

- Public Health Center (Level 3).
- Free of charge (private hospitals in the area charge 5,000 KES per visit).
- After COVID-19: All public health centers closed when the first case was confirmed in Kenya. This is because of the lack of sanitation to prevent COVID-19. I worked with Nairobi County to secure the number of protective clothing and reopened one month later on April 9, 2020.





4. Advocacy for combatting TB

- Help local health centers to improve the quality of service.
- Train 200 CHVs. Doubled the effectiveness of TB Surveillance.
- Negotiated with the Ministry of Health, MoH included Eiken Chemical's diagnostic equipment, TB-LAMP in the National TB Strategy.
- TB-LAMP is expanded by MoH, especially in remote areas.

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5. School Feeding Program

- Proposed the importance of school meals to the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Health, and Nairobi County.
- Provided school meals in slum areas with friends voluntarily.
- In Nairobi County, a school lunch program was launched under the initiative of Governor Sakaja Johnson. Now they are making a Giga kitchen (below photos).
- Pupils can provide school lunches for 5 KES (5 JPY) every day.

6. Help poorest children

- The poorest of the poor in Kenya.
- Street children: They live by selling garbage that comes from all over Nairobi. 100 to 200 KES a day is all they earn to buy drugs.
- The circle of poverty: people cannot go to school→ cannot get regular jobs→cannot afford to go to hospital→more unhealthy….
- In cooperation with Rotary, we donated athletic shoes for the children.
