



## Critical issues facing Africa's agriculture


- **Population growth** is projected to double to 2.4 billion by 2050; at the rate faster than food production
- Unemployed youth population increasing rapidly
- Agricultural productivity negatively affected by <u>climate change</u>
- Progressive <u>decline in soil fertility</u> and crop yields;
- War in Ukraine, COVID 19 pandemic, combined with ongoing conflict and climate changes are reversing years of progress to combat **malnutrition**.
- Extension and adoption of new agricultural technologies including digital technologies remain low

Minimum tillage and mulching






