

JENESYS2022 The Philippines-Japan "Food Safety" Exchange (Online Invitation Exchange) Report

1. Program Overview

[Objectives] Against the backdrop of high interest in health and Japanese food and products in the Philippines, this program was implemented with the aim of promoting understanding of the appeal of Japanese food and safe Japanese food products among Filipino students, further increasing interest in Japanese food, and eliminating harmful rumors. The group visited food-related facilities in Fukushima Prefecture, which has suffered from harmful rumors, and learned about Japan's food safety efforts and technologies, and how fresh and safe food is delivered from producers. After this program, the participants shared the safety of Japanese food through SNS in the Philippines.


