JENESYS2022 The Philippines-Japan Youth Exchange (History of Development and Economy in Japan) Outbound Program Report

1. Program Overview

[Objectives] Japanese university students learned about the relationship between Japan and the Philippines and Japan's contribution to the country's development, and introduced details on Japan's development assistance and economy to people in the Philippines. The program was implemented with the objective of promoting further understanding of Japan in the Philippines and improving mutual understanding between the two countries.




