

# JENESYS 2022 Brunei-Japan Exchange (Online Invitation Program of Japanese Language Learners) Report

## 1. Online Program Overview

[Objectives] The main purpose of the program was to provide students studying Japanese in Brunei with opportunities to learn and experience Japanese culture, industry, administration, lifestyle, culture, and local attractions, in order to motivate them to study Japanese, to promote a deeper understanding of Japanese culture, and to develop human resources who can serve as a bridge between the two countries.




