Every single young person has great potential to build peaceful societies. To turn this potential into reality, youth need to be able to feel confident that they can build peace and be provided with opportunities for empowerment.

However, this is difficult particularly when youth, women and girls face fragile situations and gender-based challenges regarding peace and security.

In this context, Japan's engagement with youth associated with non-state armed groups is based on the human security approach, which calls for protection and empowerment.

It is important to recognize that sustainable peace cannot be achieved just by the cessation of violence, but through building resilience on the ground and upholding the human dignity of every individual.

This can be realized through an inclusive approach, by ensuring

the full, equal, and meaningful participation of women and youth across political and socio-economic dimensions. It is also critical to safeguard their rights to education, as education enables them to rebuild their lives and reclaim their role in societies.

In this regard, it is commendable that Accept International provides a range of initiatives aimed at empowering youth who were once associated with armed groups. These initiatives include fostering dialogue, providing skills training, and organizing reintegration workshops.

I am certain this event will help raise awareness about the presence and unique potential of youth associated with non-state armed groups and accelerate our support to those people, towards building sustainable peace.
