Online Japan-Visit Advanced Program for JENESYS ASEAN Alumni Report (Theme: Startups)

1. Program Overview

[Objective, Overview] This programme was conducted from 25 September to 4 October 2023 (9 days in total) for alumni from the ASEAN region who have visited Japan under the JENESYS. Through webinars, virtual tours, discussions with experts, inter-participant discussions and exchange programmes specialising in 'start-ups', the programme aimed to (1) further promote understanding of Japan, (2) strengthen networking and (3) stimulate activities by alumni contributing to friendship and cooperation between ASEAN and Japan.







6. Presentations of Program Findings and Action Plan at the Reporting Session (excerpt)





[What we Learned]

We learned that Japan's international competitiveness is somewhat weakening, and that support and investment in startups are being strengthened in response to this present situation.

[Learnings about Startups]

With regard to startups, we learned about the importance of innovative thinking to differentiate oneself from other startups and produce a competitive advantage, and the necessity of investing in education.

[Action Plan]

We will organize a workshop on the ecosystem and economy of startups in the ASEAN and Japan (or possibly a topic related to how Japan has supported the ASEAN countries through foreign direct investment (FDI)), to share our experience and what we learned about Japanese culture with friends and people in the ASEAN who are interested in the theme.

[What we Learned]

In the ASEAN countries, startups are being promoted as an economic policy. However, we learned that the level of governmental support varies from country to country.

[Learnings about Startups]

We gained a wealth of practical and concrete information through discussions and exchanges regarding the startup situation in each country and from the lectures given by Professor Emeritus YONEKURA Seiichiro and the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry.

[Action Plan]

We will utilize the knowledge and insights we acquired from the program to conduct a survey to identify specific issues that startup companies are facing today. Then, JENESYS alumni who are well versed in business development, marketing and fund procurement will act as volunteer mentors to support and develop entrepreneurs and startup firms in local communities. We will also organize workshops and seminars on specialized themes such as business planning, marketing strategies, financial management, and legal aspects.
