



## 1. Dispatch of Japan Disaster Relief (JDR) Medical Team

- On April 2, JDR Medical Team was dispatched (32 members in total, including doctors and nurses) and started treating patients on April 4 in Mandalay.
- From April 12, the second batch of JDR Medical Team was dispatched (37 members).

## 2. Dispatch of Japan Self-Defense Forces Aircraft

- On April 8, one C-130 aircraft of Japan Self-Defense Forces departed Japan to transport medical goods including medicine and test kits, which are necessary for the Japan Disaster Relief (JDR) Medical Team to continue its humanitarian assistance activities. On April 9, the aircraft arrived Mandalay and the medical goods were handed over.

## 3. Provision of Emergency Relief Goods

- On April 6, the distribution of the essential goods (sanitary items, water, and water purifiers etc.) to the people affected by disasters began through the UN agencies.

## 4. Emergency Grant

- On April 2, the Govt. of Japan announced that Japan will implement Emergency Grant of approximately 6 million US dollars through international organizations (the details are decided as the table 1).

## 5. Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects

- The Govt. of Japan announced that Japan will provide emergency relief kit including water tanks and tents, to schools in the region affected by the earthquake through the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects.
