Video Message by H.E. Mr. IWAYA Takeshi, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan, for Tokyo International Law Seminar 2025

Good morning, distinguished guests, esteemed participants of the Tokyo International Law Seminar 2025! I am Takeshi Iwaya, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan.

In order to firmly anchor the "rule of law" in the whole international community, it is essential to foster human resources and promote exchanges in international Tokyo field of The the law. International Law Seminar was launched to serve as a platform for officials and legal experts from Asia and Africa to deepen their knowledge through engagement with one another as well as with leading experts in these areas. I am delighted and deeply encouraged that this Seminar is being held for the third time this year and has developed into an platform vibrant intellectually providing opportunities for learning and interactions.

I sincerely hope that, through fostering common knowledge and friendly relationships among international lawyers, the Tokyo International Law Seminar will contribute to the realization of peace guided by the "rule of law".
