

1-1. The international community at a turning point in history

The movements of the world after the Cold War

- Under a stable international order, the overall disparities among nations have been reduced.
 - → Some countries have not been able to fully enjoy the benefits; domestic disparities have widened in some developed countries.
- The rise of emerging and developing countries
 → Strengthening their voice, dissatisfaction
 - → Strengthening their voice, dissatisfaction with the existing international order
- Rapid development of science and technology

 → The scope of what needs to be protected
 has expanded to include cybersecurity and
 countering disinformation.
- Global Challenges are becoming serious.
 - → Coordination among countries and regions is essential.

1-1. The international community at a turning point in history

The meaning of Russia's aggression against Ukraine

- One of the major power entrusted with responsibility of maintaining peace and security of the world has committed a serious violation of the rules and unilaterally aggressed another country by force.
 - = Challenges to what the international community has protected together in the post-Cold War.

Furthermore ...

- Deterioration of <u>the situation in the Middle-East</u>
 → Confrontation in the international community is more complex depending on the position taken.
- Developing of emerging and developing countries
 - → As the influence of these countries grows and the dissatisfaction with the order established by developed countries.

A turning point in history

It is evident to everyone that the existing order is being threatened.

- 1 Challenge to the existing international order
- Russia launched its aggression against Ukraine in February 2022
 - An outrageous act shaking the very foundation of the international order
 - A blatant violation of the principles of the UN Charter, including the general prohibition of the use of force
 - As the only country to have ever suffered atomic bombings during war,
 Japan takes the position that Russia's nuclear threats are absolutely unacceptable, let alone the use of such weapons.
 - → It shakes the very foundation of the existing international order, which the international community has built up over a long period of hard work and much sacrifice.

Security environment in East Asia becomes ever more severe

The advancement of military cooperation

North Korea

The advancement of nuclear and missile activities, including the launch of ballistic missiles

Russia

Not only the aggression against Ukraine, but also active military activities **around Japan**



China

Extensively and rapidly enhancing military power, continuing and intensifying military activities **around Japan**

- 2 Shift in the power balance among nations
- Increasing presence of emerging and developing countries (known as the "Global South")
 - → Positions and issues vary from country to country.
- Dissatisfaction with existing rules and systems
 - → Many global issues are becoming increasingly serious.
 - → The "Pact for the Future," proposing 56 Actions including reform of the UN Security Council, was adopted at the Summit of the Future held at the UN General Assembly in September 2024.





The important thing is...

- An approach of overcoming conflict in values and interests
- A fine-tuned diplomacy to seek cooperation that is truly needed by each country

- 2 Shift in the power balance among nations
- Multilateral initiatives, such as those of the United Nations (UN), are facing difficulties.
 - → The UN Security Council has not necessarily been fulfilling its expected roles in response to the situation in Ukraine and the Middle-East, and there is a need to strengthen the functions of the UN, including reform of the UN Security Council.

What is the UN?

An international organization created after World War II to <u>ensure that</u> <u>people would never suffer from war again</u>. The UN Security Council is considered **the main body responsible for maintaining world peace**, and only a limited number of members can participate. The UN marks its 80th anniversary in 2025, but <u>some of its aspects do not adequately reflect the current state of the international community.</u>



What is "globalization"?


As the movement of people, goods and capital across national borders becomes more active, increased trade of goods and services and investment abroad deepen economic ties around the world.




- → It can bring not only positive aspects such as growth and prosperity, but also security threats.
 - The potential <u>shortages of food and energy supply</u> due to the impact of conflicts and infectious diseases on exports and imports
 - Possibility of <u>intellectual property and technologies being stolen</u>



2-1. Basic policy of Japan's diplomacy

The international community at the "turning point in history"



Maintaining and strengthening the international order based on values and rules will lead the world toward reconciliation and cooperation through "diplomacy of dialogue and cooperation"

1 Maintaining a free and open international order based on the rule of law

While the existing international order is under serious challenges, the rule of law is emphasized as a means of maintaining peace.


What is the rule of law?

The concept that recognizes the superiority of the law over all forms of power. It is an essential cornerstone of a fair and just society within a country and constitutes the basis of the international order that consists of friendly and equitable relations between states.



To explain plainly, the idea is to <u>create an international atmosphere of</u> "Let's follow the rules!" For example, if there is a rule that says, "Don't take what belongs to others," and someone breaks the rule, everyone else will imitate them, and the situation could turn into a competition by force. It is precisely because no one breaks the rule that we can all get along.

- 1 Maintaining a free and open international order based on the rule of law
- Further strengthening the Japan-U.S. Alliance
 - > The U.S. is Japan's only ally, and the Japan-U.S. Alliance is the foundation of Japan's foreign policy and security.
 - Strengthen ties not only in diplomacy and defense, but also in economy and other fields.
- Japan will strengthen its multilayered network not only in the U.S. but also with "colleagues who can cooperate with Japan."



1 Maintaining a free and open international order based on the rule of law

"Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP)

- ➤ Intersection of "two continents" the fast-growing Asia and the high-potential Africa and "two oceans" that are essential for trade and other activities.
 → The Key to Global Stability and Prosperity!
- The countries that share the same ideas, such as "the importance of following the rules," will join forces to protect peace and security throughout the region.

- 1 Maintaining a free and open international order based on the rule of law
- Strengthen Japan's ability to defend itself
 - Under the National Security Strategy, Japan will strengthen its own initiatives and cooperative relationships with various countries in critical challenges and fields.
 - Implement OSA (Official Security Assistance), a framework which provides grants to friendly countries' armed forces to purchase equipment and supplies as well as develop infrastructure.

Why does OSA contribute to national security?

Amidst the growing security threats in the region surrounding Japan, Japan must cooperate in strengthening not only its own defense capabilities but also those of its neighbors. The OSA also enables cooperation to strengthen the security and deterrence capabilities of friendly countries, which will contribute to peace and security throughout the Indo-Pacific region.

2 Relations with various countries and regions

The ROK:

- An important neighboring country with which Japan should work together in dealing with various issues and continue to communicate closely
- Usher in a new era as partners
- Deal in a resolute manner regarding Takeshima

China:

- Comprehensively promoting a "Mutually Beneficial Relationship Based on Common Strategic Interests" and building "constructive and stable Japan-China relations"
- There are many concerns and issues, but through repeated dialogue, Japan will assert its position while cooperating on matters of common interest.

Russia:

Japan-Russia relations are in a difficult situation, but Japan will firmly maintain its policy of concluding a peace treaty through resolution of the territorial issue.

Japan-China-ROK:

The Ninth Japan-China-ROK Trilateral Foreign Ministers' Meeting was held in March 2025. The three countries will promote practical cooperation for the future.

2 Relations with various countries and regions

Africa:

With a growing population, dynamic growth can be expected in the future. Through initiatives such as **TICAD**, Japan will work together to address challenges.

The Middle East:

Japan depends on the region for about 90% of its crude oil imports. This region is very important for ensuring stable energy supplies. Japan strengthens cooperation through the "Japan-Arab Political Dialogue" and the "Japan-GCC Foreign Ministers' Meeting."

Central Asia and the Caucasus:

These countries have been greatly affected in various aspects by Russia. Japan will promote cooperation such as "Central Asia plus Japan" Dialogue.



Pacific Island Countries:

Strategically very important as a partner that shares values and principles. Japan and Pacific Island countries host **PALM**.



Latin America and the Caribbean: Geographically distant but close to Japan in values. The world's largest Nikkei community as a bridge of friendship. Partners in exporting abundant resources, energy, and food to Japan.

Southwest Asia:

India is an important partner to realize a **FOIP**. Japan and Southwest Asian countries enjoy traditional friendly relationships and they offer attractive markets and production bases for Japanese companies.



Southeast Asia:

The stability and prosperity of ASEAN, which is the key to the realization of FOIP, is important for the entire region. **Japan-ASEAN friendship and cooperation** celebrate its 50th anniversary in 2023.



- 3 Promotion of cultural and people-to-people exchanges
 - Deepening mutual understanding beyond national boundaries!



Dissemination of the attractions of Japan through cultural programs and other activities (from traditional to pop culture) implemented by diplomatic missions overseas and the Japan Foundation will lead to a better understanding of Japan and the smooth implementation of Japan's foreign policy.

- 4 Economic diplomacy
- Expanding and maintaining the Rules-based Free and Fair Trade
 - Strengthening and maintaining the multilateral trading system with the WTO at its core.

The WTO is an international organization that helps member countries to 1) make rules, 2) settle disputes and 3) monitor rule compliance so that member countries can <u>freely</u> trade goods and services.

- Addressing to the "economic security"
 - > Ensuring Japan's peace, security, and economic prosperity through the initiatives in economic field in cooperation with other countries.

4 Economic diplomacy

- Incorporate the growth of developing and emerging countries, the Global South, to Japan
 - \rightarrow Fine-tuned and strategic economic diplomacy for each country and region

Also, actively utilizing soft power, e.g. Japanese culture, science and technology!

- Contribute to the overseas expansion of Japanese companies and exports of Japanese food products by utilizing officials in diplomatic missions overseas including those in charge of cross-border economic affairs and Japanese business support
- Implement more effective development cooperation/ODA by proposing attractive
 assistance to partner countries through the "co-creation for common agenda initiative"
 and by collaborating closely with private companies and other stakeholders

5 Issues addressed multilaterally



- Working to strengthening the functions of the UN, including reform of the UN Security Council
- Japan will speak out firmly against serious human rights violations, support the efforts of other countries, and promote <u>human rights diplomacy in its own way.</u>
- Promoting diplomacy centered on the participation of women, as part of Women,
 Peace and Security (WPS) initiatives
- 2025 marks the 80th year since the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.
 Japan will advance efforts toward a world without nuclear weapons.

What is "human security"?
