### Part I

#### **KATO, Iori**

Regional Director for Asia and the Pacific, International Organization for Migration (IOM)  
Originally from Japan, Mr. Iori KATO has over 20 years of experience within the UN system. He has held a range of senior leadership positions, including Senior Regional Advisor (SRA) to the Director-General of IOM for the Asia and Pacific Region, as well as

several other high-level positions with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in the Pacific, Bangladesh, and the Philippines, and has contributed to humanitarian responses and development initiatives across the region. Prior to joining the UN system in 2003, he worked as a newspaper journalist. He holds a Master's degree in International Affairs from Columbia University in New York and a Bachelor's degree from International Christian University in Tokyo.

### **YAMAWAKI, Keizo**

Professor, School of Global Japanese Studies, Meiji University

Professor Yamawaki's research focuses on intercultural cohesion and migration policy. He has served on numerous national government advisory committees related to foreign resident policies, including those of the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications and the Ministry of Justice. At the local level, he has also served on advisory bodies on intercultural cohesion policies for several local governments, including the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the prefectures of Gunma and Aichi, and as an advisor to the Council of Municipalities with Large Foreign Populations. He studied European immigration policy at the University of Oxford in 2012 and conducted research on city networks in Australia at the University of Queensland in 2024. His publications include *An Introduction to Intercultural Cities: Practices in Europe, Japan, Korea, and Australia* (co-editor, Akashi Shoten, 2022), among numerous other works.

### **KIM, Hwa Yeon**

Associate Research Fellow, Migration Research and Training Center (MRTC)

Dr. Hwa Yeon Kim is an Associate Research Fellow at the Migration Research and Training Center (MRTC), Korea. She earned her Ph.D. in Public Administration from Sungkyunkwan University. Her research focuses on immigration policy, the organizational effectiveness of migrant workers, and local-level governance integration. Dr. Kim chairs the Committee for Collaboration with Early-career Scholars at the Korea Association for Immigration Policy & Administration and serves as a Board Member of the Korean Association for Policy Studies. She specializes in human resource

management for migrant workers and immigration governance, providing evidence-based policy alternatives to systematize immigration policies and enhance administrative efficiency through data-driven analysis.

Mr. Giancarlo Uehara is a third-generation Japanese Peruvian who came to Japan in 2006. After working in manufacturing and as a community interpreter, he provided consultation services for foreign residents at the Konan International Association and received the Grand Prize at a speech contest organized by the Biwako Japanese Language Network in 2012. From 2013, he worked at the Mie International Exchange Foundation, engaging in training community interpreters and promoting community-based multicultural disaster preparedness. He also serves as Vice Chair of his local neighborhood association, promoting Plain Japanese and interaction between foreign residents and local communities.
