

Annex 7 referred to in Chapters 7 and 8
Reservations for Future Measures

1. The Schedule of a Party sets out, pursuant to paragraph 3 of Articles 66 and 101, the reservations taken by that Party with respect to specific sectors, sub-sectors or activities for which it may maintain existing, or adopt new or more restrictive, measures that do not conform with obligations imposed by:

- (a) Article 58 or 98 (National Treatment);
- (b) Article 59 or 99 (Most-Favored-Nation Treatment);
- (c) Article 64 (Senior Management and Boards of Directors);
- (d) Article 65 (Performance Requirements); or
- (e) Article 100 (Local Presence).

2. Each reservation sets out the following elements:

- (a) "Sector" refers to the general sector in which a reservation is taken;
- (b) "Sub-Sector" refers to the specific sector in which a reservation is taken;
- (c) "Industry Classification" refers, where applicable, to the activity covered by the reservation according to domestic industry classification codes;
- (d) "Type of Reservation" specifies the obligation referred to in paragraph 1 above for which a reservation is taken;
- (e) "Description" sets out the scope of the sector, sub-sector or activities covered by the reservation; and
- (f) "Existing Measures" identifies, for transparency purposes, existing measures that apply to the sector, sub-sector or activities covered by the reservation.

3. In the interpretation of a reservation, all elements of the reservation shall be considered. The "Description" element shall prevail over all other elements.

4. Nothing in this Annex shall affect interpretation of the provision of subparagraph 2(c) of Article 97 with respect to measures affecting traffic rights in air transport services or services directly related to the exercise of such traffic rights.

5. Nothing in the reservation for Article 65 lodged in the Schedule of Japan shall be construed so as to derogate from the obligations of Japan under the Agreement on Trade Related Investment Measures in Annex 1A to the WTO Agreement.

6. For the purposes of this Annex:

the term "CMAP" means Mexican Classification of Activities and Products (Clasificación Mexicana de Actividades y Productos) numbers as set out in National Institute for Statistics, Geography and Informatics (Instituto Nacional de Estadística, Geografía e Informática), Mexican Classification of Activities and Products (Clasificación Mexicana de Actividades y Productos), 1994; and

the term "JSIC" means Japan Standard Industrial Classification numbers as set out in the Statistics Bureau, Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications, Japan Standard Industrial Classification, revised March 7, 2002.
